elcome our new Pastor Father Greg Faryna

"Father Greg, we want to take this opportunity to welcome you with open arms to your new parish family!"

I had the opportunity to sit down with Father Greg this past week and I want to share that conversation with all of you so you can get to know him as I did.

Father Greg was born on January 19, 1965 (yes he said it was ok to share), in Viking AB. At the time his family lived on a farm south of Holden. Father Greg told me he still likes to go out to the family farm to relax and get away.

Father Greg's Mom passed away 20 years ago. He is the primary care giver to his Father who still lives in his own home in Edmonton. He is the youngest of four children (all in the Edmonton area), with 2 older brothers and a sister. Sadly, his sister was diagnosed with ALS in February of 2016. Our thoughts and prayers are with her and your entire family.

Father Greg decided to become a priest in his early 30's. When he was young he went to church with his family most Sundays. After high school he was a C & E Christian (Christmas and Easter). About 8 years later he decided to start going to church again for no particular reason. He said it just felt comfortable. One Sunday the priest's homily was about parents not blocking their children's vocation. For half a moment he thought he might want to become a priest, but then he thought, 'give your head a shake no one does that anymore'. But God is persistent and for the next 6 years it seemed as though everything that happened in his life pointed in that direction. He approached the parish priest and started his studies with the Basilian Order but later chose to study under the Bishop of Edmonton, entering Holy Spirit Seminary in Ottawa in 1998.

On October 11, 2003 Father Greg was ordained in his home parish - St. Basil's in Edmonton. His parish assignments were as follows:

2003 to 2007 - Assistant Pastor at the Cathedral in Edmonton, as well as Administrator (looking after a parish in the absence of the resident priest,) for Holy Eucharist and Holy Cross parishes in Edmonton.

2008 to 2013 - Chancellor of the Edmonton Eparchy.

2013 to 2017 - Pastor of Camrose District parishes.

When asked about his feelings when he heard he was moving to St. Stephen's he was shocked, but after discussions with Bishop David, Father Mark and Father Bohdan, he felt that it would be a good move.

Questions for Father Greg:

What do you see as your priorities in this first year at St. Stephen's? Understanding how the parish works and not changing parish life to my perspective but adapting my ministry to the needs of the parish. Be sure the spiritual life is fed first, and then focus on pastoral, charitable and administrative work.

What do you like to do in your spare time? I enjoy doing yard work on the family farm. I like hiking, camping, skiing and golf ... I want to learn how to snowboard.

What would we be surprised to learn about you? I worked in the parts department in the automotive industry until I entered the seminary.

What does a typical day at work look like for you? It will be different from Camrose. I have never had 2 days the same throughout my entire priesthood.

Where do you see God moving in your own life in your role as a priest? Definitely as my Guide, my Support, that which brings me peace.

What advice would you give young people considering the priesthood or other vocations? Be open to God's presence in your life. We get so distracted we don't even feel God's presence. Don't let the perspectives and opinions of others keep you away from your faith life.

Where do you see the greatest challenges for us as people of faith? Christianity is so counter cultural. Maybe that is a blessing as the early church was also counter cultural, forcing people to make a decision about how they wanted to live their lives. I feel the revolutionary teachings of Jesus then and now, is that life is not just about me, but rather how I can assist others. To be Christian is to be communal.

Is there a verse or quote that inspires you? Psalm 51 verse 1 "Have mercy on me O God, according to your unfailing love ..."

How can we as a congregation support you as you settle into your new life at St. Stephen's? Just be patient with me, I know I will make mistakes. I look forward to having those pastoral relationships so I can become part of your family.

Remember that the way we welcome children in church directly affects the way they respond to Church, to God and to Christ. Let them know that they are at home in this sacred space.


