Ephesians 4:7-13

B rothers and Sisters, each of us was given grace according to the measure of Christ's gift. Therefore, it is said, "When He ascended on high, He made captivity itself a captive: He gave gifts to His people." (When it says "He ascended", what does it mean but that He had also descended into the lower parts of the earth? He Who ascended is the same One Who ascended far above all the heavens, so that He might fill all things.) The gifts He gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ.

At the end of the Epistle parents may send their children to the back of the church to get candles for the reading of the Holy Gospel.

A COLLISION OF TWO SEASONS: The Christmas season starts 40 days before Christmas as we begin St. Philip's Fast (Nov 15) and continues till 40 days after Christmas on the feast of the Presentation of our Lord into the Temple (Feb 2). This is why we keep up the Christmas décor and caroling in our parish.

The Easter Cycle has a 4 week Pre-Lenten season, which is followed by 40 days of Lent, then Holy Week, then Easter itself, followed by 40 days of feasting till the feast of the Ascention and another 10 more till the Feast of Pentecost.

Sometimes, when Easter comes early, like this year, the two seasons overlap. We sing Christmas Carols and we start planning our Lenten Journey. Today is both, the Sunday after Theophany as well as the Sunday of Zacchaeus which marks the beginning of Pre-Lent. Since the former ranks higher then the latter the readings are taken from the Sunday After Theophany, but we still recognize that the preparation for Lent begins tomorrow. Lent itself begins on Monday February 8 (Roman Catholic's start 2 days later).





PARISH SUPPORT FOR SYRIAN FAMILY - UPDATE



To the parents of our young children may we suggest...

Relax! God put the wiggle in children; don't feel you have to suppress it in God's house. But do prevent them from kicking people in the pews.

Sit towards the front where it is easier to see and hear.

Quietly explain the parts of the Liturgy to your children.

Sing the hymns, pray and voice the responses. Children learn liturgical behaviours by copying you.

If you need to leave Liturgy with your child, please feel free to do so, but please come back. You can also take advantage of the "cry room".

Remember that the way we welcome children in church directly affects the way they respond to Church, to God and to Christ. Let them know that they are at home in this sacred space.

We love pew art! Please use the blank papers and colouring sheets provided in the "cry room" (not pew envelopes) for your child to draw us some beautiful art. We can hang them on our parish bulletin boards for all to enjoy.

Do your best to attend Liturgy on time.
