What's the buzz in the news recently about Catholic Schools, the Government, Bishop Henry and the LGBT guidelines?

This past Wednesday (Jan 13) Bishop Henry, the Roman Catholic Bishop of Calgary, wrote a letter in response to the government's (Alberta Education's) new guidelines for transgender policies. Bishop Henry basically said that the guidelines are trying to force the Catholic Schools to deal with

transgendered persons in a non-Catholic (secular) way which is not acceptable. The media (who's job it is to make news interesting) stirred the pot and tried, sometimes successfully, to get people emotionally charged about it. In the end many people were given the (false) impression that Bishop Henry and the Catholic Community is anti LGBT.

The reality is that as Catholics we teach that all people are made in the image of God and deserve respect and dignity. Our Schools and Churches already have policies in place that protect the dignity of all people including the LGBT community. We also teach that chastity is necessary for all people; straight, gay, married or single. One's sexual orientation is never a sin, but unchaste sexual behavior is, regardless of one's orientation.

Bishop Henry fears that "Gay Straight Alliances", as mandated by these guidelines, are tools that can be used to legitimize all sexual activity, which is contrary to Catholic Church teachings.


"The Alberta Government "Guidelines" issued on January 13th show no evidence of consultation with or sensitivity to the Catholic community. They breathe pure secularism."

"Our Catholic schools are committed to supporting inclusive communities that teach care and compassion for every person, regardless of age, race, sex, gender or sexual orientation, and require that every person be treated with dignity and respect."

"GSAs and QSAs are highly politicized ideological clubs which seek to cure society of "homophobia" and "heterosexism," and which accept the idea that all forms of consensual sexual expression are legitimate. The view of sexuality that they espouse is not Catholic."

### **Sunday of the Publican and Pharisee**

The theme of this parable is repentance. Repentance is the door through which we enter Lent, the starting-point of the journey to Pascha. To repent signifies far more than selfpity or futile regret over things done in the past. The Greek term metanoia means "change of mind." To repent is to be renewed, to be transformed in our inward viewpoint, to attain a fresh way of looking at our relationship with God and with others. The fault of the Pharisee is that he has



no desire to change his outlook; he is complacent, self-satisfied, and so he allows no place for God to act within him. The Gospel depicts him as a man that is pleased only with himself who thinks that he has complied with all of the requirements of religion. But in his pride, he has falsified the meaning of true religion and faith. He has reduced these to external observations, measuring his piety by the amount of money he gives.

The Publican, on the other hand, truly longs for a "change of mind." He humbles himself, and his humility justifies him before God. He becomes, in the words of the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5:3), "poor in spirit." He acknowledges that he is a sinner, and he knows that salvation is only found in the mercy of God. Here we find an example of true humility, an essential aspect of repentance. A "change of mind" and the transformation of our lives can only happen when we humble ourselves before God, acknowledge our willingness to turn from sin, and receive His grace into our lives.

Our preparation for Lent thus begins with a prayer for humility, the beginning of true repentance. Through repentance, we can find and return to the true order of things, a restoration of our spiritual vision that will guide us in a very difficult and challenging world. By entering Great Lent in humility and repentance, we can attain deeper communion with God as we receive His forgiveness and He blesses by guiding us to greater spiritual heights.

Remember that the way we welcome children in church directly affects the way they respond to Church, to God and to Christ. Let them know that they are at home in this sacred space.




