Epistle Romans 10:1-10

B rothers and Sisters, my heart's desire and prayer to God for them is that they may be saved. I can testify that they have a zeal for God, but it is not enlightened. For, being I gnorant of the righteousness that comes from God, and seeking to establish their own, they have not submitted to God's righteousness. For Christ is the end of the law so that there may be righteousness for everyone who believes.

Moses writes concerning the righteousness that comes from the law, that "the person who does these things will live by them." But the righteousness that comes from faith says, "Do not say in your heart, 'Who will ascend into heaven?'" (that is, to bring Christ down) "or 'Who will descend into the abyss?'" (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead). But what does it say? "The word is near you, on your lips and in your heart" (that is, the word of faith that we proclaim); because if you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For one believes with the heart and so is justified, and one confesses with the mouth and so is saved.

Jude, a servant of Jesus Christ and brother of James, to those who are called, who are beloved in God the Father and kept safe for Jesus Christ: May mercy, peace, and love be yours in abundance. Beloved, while eagerly preparing to write to you about the salvation we share, I find it necessary to write and appeal to you to contend for the faith that was once for all entrusted to the saints. man who is moved towards doing one thing or another purely by the consciousness of God's will and the desire to please Him, never prefers one activity to another, even if one is great and lofty, and another petty and insignificant; but he has his will equally disposed towards either, so long as they are pleasing to God. So whether he does something lofty and great or petty and insignificant, he remains equally calm and content. How many times have I prayed for what seemed a good thing for me and not leaving it to God to do as He knows best But having obtained what I begged for, I found myself in distress because I had not asked for it to be, rather, according to God's will.

>> Christ used hyperbole often, for example when he declared, "If your right eye causes you to sin, pluck it out and throw it away; it is better that you lose one of your members than that your whole body be thrown into hell" (Matt. 5:28, cf. 18:9, Mark 9:47). Christ certainly did not intend this to be applied literally, for otherwise all Christians would be blind amputees! (cf. 1 John 1:8; 1 Tim. 1:15). Using strong words as he often did, Jesus condemned the misuse of authority rather than the use of certain terms of address. Regarding the term "father," Jesus is forbidding us to confuse any human fatherly relationship with the spiritual Fatherhood that God alone has. When we address priests as "father" we always do so with the recognition that God is our true Father. The ancient Christian practice of calling priests "father" goes all the way back to the time of the apostles, and the theology behind it is evident in Scripture. While on trial before the Sanhedrein--the Jewish high council of priests and elders--the first Christian martyr, Stephen, addresses them formally as "brothers and fathers" (Acts 7:2). This is a key passage to consider, since Scripture tells us that Stephen was filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke these words under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit (cf. Acts 7:55). There is no way that the Holy Spirit could have inspired Stephen to address the Jewish priests as "father" if Christ had indeed literally forbidden Christians from calling men by that title. If so, there would have been a direct contradiction between a command of Christ and a prompting of the Holy Spirit, and common sense tells us how absurd that idea is. The New Testament is filled with examples of and references to spiritual father-son and father-child relationships. Paul regularly referred to Timothy as his child: "To Timothy, my true child in the faith: grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord" (1 Tim. 1:2). "You then, my son, be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus" (2 Tim. 2:1). Paul also referred to other of his converts in this way: "To Titus, my true child in a common faith: grace and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Savior" (Titus 1:4), "I appeal to you for my child, Onesimus, whose father I have become in my imprisonment" (Philemon 10). Clearly, none of these men were Paul's literal, biological sons. Rather, Paul is emphasizing his spiritual fatherhood with them. Perhaps the most pointed New Testament reference to the theology of the spiritual fatherhood of priests is Paul's statement, "I do not write this to make you ashamed, but to admonish you as my beloved children. For though you have countless guides in Christ, you do not have many fathers. For I became your father in Christ Jesus through the gospel" (1 Cor. 4:14-15). The apostles sometimes referred to entire churches under their care as their children. Paul writes, "My little children, with whom I am again in travail until Christ be formed in you!" (Gal. 4:19). John said, "No greater joy can I have than this, to hear that my children follow the truth" (3 John 4). In fact, John also addresses men in his congregations as "fathers" (1 John 2:13 By referring to these people as their spiritual sons and spiritual children, Peter and Paul and John implicitly refer to themselves as their spiritual fathers. Since the Bible frequently speaks of this spiritual fatherhood, we Catholics acknowledge it and follow the custom of the apostles by calling priests "father." Failure to acknowledge this in fact is a failure to recognize and honor a great gift God has bestowed on the Church: the spiritual fatherhood of the priesthood. Catholics have great filial affection for priests and call them "father," knowing that as members of their parishes they have been committed to their spiritual care, and have a filial relationship with them. Priests, in turn, follow the biblical example of the apostles by referring to the members of their flocks as "my son" or "my child" (cf. Gal. 4:19, 1 Tim. 1:18, 2 Tim. 2:1, Philemon 10, 1 Pet. 5:13, 1 John 2:1, 3 John 4).

Remember that the way we welcome children in church directly affects the way they respond to Church, to God and to Christ. Let them know that they are at home in this sacred space.


