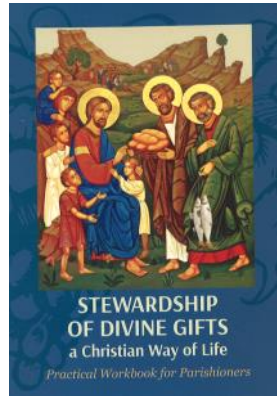

Holy Priest-Martyr Babylas, Bishop of Antioch (250);

## Gospel

Matthew 22:35-46

The Lord told this parable : "A man going abroad, called his servants and handed over his goods to them. And to one he gave five talents, to another two, and to another one, to each according to his particular ability, and then he went on his journey. And he who had received the five talents went and traded with them, and gained five more. In like manner, he who had received the two gained two more. But he who had received the one went away and dug in the earth and hid his master's money. Then after a long time the master of those servants came and settled accounts with them. And the one who had received the five talents came and brought five other talents, saying, 'Master, you gave me five talents; look, I have gained five more.' His master said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant; because you have been faithful over a few things, I will set you over many; enter into the joy of your master.' Likewise, the one who had received the two

Julian's decision was not "volcanic", as it has been for some who have chosen the priestly or monastic vocation, he says. "God gently led me for about 10 years."

Julian began thinking about the priesthood when he entered the University of Alberta at the age of 16. He spent three years working towards a Bachelor of Music degree, with cello being his performance instrument. After these studies he entered the Faculty of Law.

While working towards his law degree, Julian lived at the Basilian House of Studies and found that it was a "good time of spiritual growth." He smiles when it is suggested to him that he is following in the footsteps of his relative, the first Edmonton Eparch from 1948 to 1986, the Most Reverend Bishop Neil Savaryn, OSBM. He explains that he would prefer to leave the door open to married priesthood rather than the monastic tradition.

Julian has been a cellist since 1995, when he was five years old. He has founded a number of small businesses and like his grandfather, prominent Ukrainian Catholic community leader Peter Savaryn, solicitor and chancellor of the University of Alberta from 1982-1986, Julian entered the legal profession. Earning a JD (juris doctor) degree in 2013, he practiced commercial litigation law in Edmonton from 2014 – 2016. In both his musical and law pursuits, he received numerous awards.

In his first year, Julian will be concentrating on philosophy at the University of Alberta. The following three years will be dedicated to the study of theology.

Although he felt that the Holy Spirit was gently nudging him towards a priestly vocation, Julian delayed making this momentous decision. Finally, in February of 2016, he contacted Most Reverend Bishop David Motiuk, Eparch of Edmonton, to inform him of his desire to undertake preparation for the priesthood.

Since then, he says, he has found a "deep peace with the decision."

I warmly welcome them, and am sure that you all will as well. (and I apologize to Mariya for spelling her name wrong in last week's bulletin).

Below is a little greeting from them (written by Mariya) to all of you (with only one edit about sports from me).

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Hello!

First of all, let us just say how grateful we are to be here, at St. Stephen Parish, for our internship year. Though the internship just officially began on September 1, we have visited the parish a few times throughout the summer and have felt overwhelmingly welcomed each time.

Both Deacon Andrij and his wife, Mariya, were born in Ukraine. Their families moved to Alberta in 1994 and 2000, respectively. They lived in Edmonton and attended the same community events but never actually met each other until the summer of 2012 (thanks to Patriarch Sviatoslav, but that's a long story...) Once things got rolling, it quickly turned into an avalanche... After getting married, they lived in Ottawa while Andrij worked through his seminary formation. Both of their daughters - Mahdalyna and Zakhariya - were born in Ottawa. Now they are excited to be living in Calgary. They are not really into sports, so neither the Edmonton Oilers, the Calgary Flames nor any CLF team will be in his homilies (unlike Fr. Bo with those Riders). For us in the end, home is where the family is.



Deacon Andrij loves to learn new things, whether it be outdoorsy stuff or home improvement or martial arts or history, you name it. He also spends his free time playing with his daughters, making wine, playing musical instruments, and being an awesome husband. Besides his theology degree he also has degrees in political science, economics and psychology; but working for God seems to offer the best retirement benefits.

Mariya (yes, it is spelled weirdly) loves to drink black tea and read, though since having kids she has only had time to read cook books (the ones with the pretty pictures). In the far past (so, 5 years ago), she was an accountant and a family photographer on the side. Now she dreams of one day knowing everything about homesteading - growing enough food to feed the family year round; pickling and canning;

hemming, sewing and mending; and maybe even having some chickens.

The girls are just a blessing, and teach us something new practically every day. Mahdalyna loves to do her own thing, and, to her disappointment, Zakhariya just loves to follow her around most of the time.

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### What is a deacon?

Deaconate is the first of three major ordained Holy Orders in the Church. (Lectors, candlebearers, readers, etc. are minor orders.) One must be a deacon before becoming a priest, and a priest before becoming a bishop. The word "deacon" is derived from the Greek word *diákonos* (διάκονος), which is a standard Greek word meaning "servant", "waiting-man", "minister", or "messenger". One commonly promulgated speculation as to its etymology is that it literally means "through the dust", referring to the dust raised by the busy

of the Anaphora. In keeping with Eastern tradition, he is not permitted to perform any Sacred Mysteries (sacraments) on his own, except for Baptism *in extremis* (in danger of death), conditions under which anyone, including the laity, may baptize. When assisting at a normal baptism, it is often the deacon who goes down into the water with the one being baptized (Acts 8:38). In contrast to the Roman Catholic Church, deacons in the Eastern Churches may not preside at the celebration of marriages, as in Eastern theology the

**PETROUHAILE (a life line for seniors)**



There are four major feasts in the Church honouring Mary, the Theotokos. The first of these is the feast of her nativity which is kept on the eighth of September.

The record of the birth of Mary is not found in the Bible. The traditional account of the event is taken from the apocryphal writings which are not part of the New Testament scriptures. The traditional teaching which is celebrated in the hymns and verses of the festal liturgy is that Joachim and Anna were a pious Jewish couple who were among the small and faithful remnant—"the poor and the needy"—who were awaiting the promised messiah. The couple was old and childless. They prayed earnestly to the Lord for a child, since among the Jews barrenness was a sign of God's disfavor. In answer to their prayers, and as the reward of their unwavering

whole universe. The Sun of Righteousness, Christ our God, has shone from you, O Theotokos. By annulling the curse he bestowed a blessing. By destroying death he has granted us eternal life (Troparion).

By your nativity, O most pure virgin, Joachim and Anna are freed from barrenness; Adam and Eve from the corruption of death. And we, your people, freed from the guilt of sin, celebrate and sing to you: The barren woman gives birth to the Theotokos, the Nourisher of our Life (Kontakion).

The fact that there is no Biblical verification of the facts of Mary's birth is incidental to the meaning of the feast. Even if the actual background of the event as celebrated in the Church is questionable from an historical point of view, the divine meaning of it "for us men and for our salvation" is obvious. There had to be one born of human flesh and blood who would be spiritually capable of being the Mother of Christ, and she herself had to be born into the world of persons who were spiritually capable of being her parents.

The feast of the Nativity of the Theotokos, therefore, is a glorification of Mary's birth, of Mary herself and of her righteous parents. It is a celebration as well of the very first preparation of the salvation of the world. For the "Vessel of Light," the "Book of the Word of Life," the "Door to the Orient," the "Throne of Wisdom" is being prepared on earth by God Himself in the birth of the holy girl-child Mary.

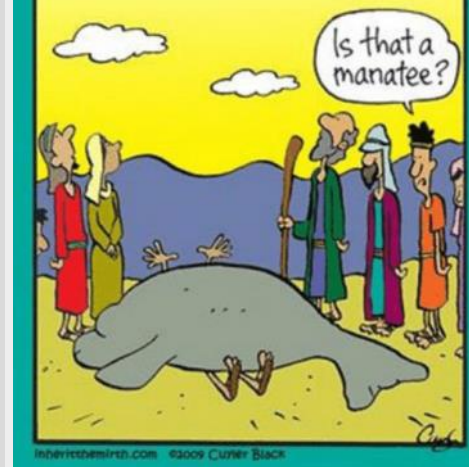
