

HOW DO WE RECEIVE COMMUNION?

In the Byzantine Catholic Church all Catholic faithful (and Orthodox faithful) in the state of Grace are encouraged to receive the Holy Communion during the Divine Liturgy. In other words, to receive Holy Communion one must be a Baptized Catholic or Orthodox believer unstained by grave sin. Regular Holy Confession is expected, although not before every reception of Holy Communion. A Christian way of life is a pre-condition as is the adherence to the Ten Commandments. Grave sin bars one from Holy Communion.

In our tradition Holy Communion is given under both species, bread and wine, which is placed in the mouth using a spoon. The spoon simplifies things for us, since we use leavened bread called *prosphora*. This is baked with a special recipe and marked with special markings (see the previous week's bulletin). We do not use the unleavened (flat wafer) bread used by Latin Catholics.

If someone cannot receive either the bread or the wine, then arrangements can be made to receive one and not the other. For example, in our Church we have a special *celiac* chalice reserved only for consecrated wine, in which case the person will come up and the priest will offer to drink from this chalice. Likewise, we reserve a few pieces of consecrated bread which we do not put into the communion chalice, in which case the person can receive only the consecrated bread.

In the Byzantine tradition, Communion in the hand is NOT an option. To receive Communion, open your mouth wide without extending your tongue and tilt your head back so that the priest can tip the contents of the communion spoon into your mouth.

Here are some highlights:

- ◆ As you approach the chalice, cross your arms over your chest in an X to keep them out of the way. You may make the sign of the cross and bow at a safe distance from the chalice. We don't want to accidentally send the chalice flying.
- Please tell Father (or the person distributing Communion) your Christian/Baptismal name as you approach.
- Tilt your head back and open your mouth wide (like a baby bird).
- Do NOT stick your tongue out. This is the most important one to remember.
- ◆ Do not say anything after you have received this is to be really careful with the Eucharist particles, so as not to create opportunities for accidents to occur.

After you receive the Holy Communion you are encouraged and expected to pray the "Prayers after Holy Communion" (on p. 80/81 of the liturgy books). You may pray them while you are waiting for the rest of the congregation to receive the Communion. However, it is more important that you participate in the Divine Liturgy, even in singing the communion hymn, therefore, please reserve those prayers for the end of the Divine Liturgy.
