ST. STEPHEN'S MUSIC MINISTRY

Let me preface this story by giving you some background information. It all started with a phone conversation I had with John Siroishka about the new CD the Choir is launching on Sunday, November 13th. After some research, I realized that I needed to share not only the "10:30 choir" story, but to share that we are a community rich with a wonderful "MUSIC MINISTRY". Allow me share with you more about each of our Music Ministries.

10:30 DIVINE LITURGY: What does "the choir" mean? These are the people that occupy the choir loft for every 10:30 a.m. sung liturgy and for all other major sung celebrations in our church. "The choir" had its humble beginnings in 1972 with approximately 10 singers in the then permanent site of our church. It all started in a building, no longer in existence, where the north parking lot now exists. It is a blessing beyond measure that several of today's choir singers were there when it all started and it is very fitting to pay tribute to those that can lay claim to this milestone. Forty-four sounds like a lot of years ... and it is!

At present, there are approximately 40-50 choir members participating regularly, responding to "the call", and the request list is long and varied. Dr. Linda Dudar is the fourth Choir Director at St. Stephen's and this year celebrates 33 years of dedicated service. A team of assistant directors willingly step in when Linda has scheduling conflicts. The choir is always in "recruitment mode" and anyone with the love for music, the interest and the time to commit, is encouraged to contact the Choir Director.

We are filled with gratitude and we pray that the Light of Jesus will always shine brightly through each one of us, and through our voices, as we continue to praise God through the Music Ministry at St. Stephen's, a VERY special place.

Parish and Office Support will now be provided by two part-time roles. We are seeking to fill these two new roles within our Parish community:



Office Administrator — This role will work 4 days/week, 7.5 hours/day. The primary responsibilities include general office and parish administration, and accounting duties.

Sacramental Coordinator — This role will work 27 hours/week, with some regular office hours, and some evening and weekend hours as needed.
