Troparia and Kontakia

Troparion: While the tomb was sealed, O Christ God, You dawned as life from the sepulcher, and while the doors were shut, You came to Your disciples, the Resurrection of all, renewing a right spirit in us through them, according to Your great mercy.

Gospel John 20:19-31

hen it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe." A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

ICON OF THE DAY

Antipascha: St Thomas Sunday

The icon of the Sunday of Thomas depicts Christ standing in the midst of the disciples. He has appeared to the eleven in the upper room, and he is inviting Thomas to come and examine his hands and his side. Thomas is reaching out to touch the side of Jesus. He is also looking to Jesus in a manner that indicates his faith and the proclamation recorded in Scripture.

Our Church devotes the first Sunday after Easter to Evangelic story about Thomas, Christ's disciple who said he wouldn't believe the resurrection of Jesus Christ till he touched Him himself. What is the essence of this story? And why does the Church pay our attention to it after Pascha at once as if saying to us, "This is written for you, it concerns each of you". And really, the events of this story take place in the world eternally, and nowadays they may happen more often than in the days when doubting Thomas met his resurrected Master. What is all this about? Of course, first of all, about our faith, its essence, its fundamental difference from that rational knowledge which is based on the fact we saw, heard and touched ourselves.

All Christianity is based on the faith in Christ Resurrection, on belief that once in earthly history, in the whole world the death was overcame and the dead resurrected. And if there is no such faith, then there remains in Christianity only some general teaching about love, kindness, forgiveness, the teaching that can be found in other religions and philosophies.

To be a Christian from the very beginning meant to believe just this unprecedented, impossible and nevertheless real victory over death. "If Christ has not been raised, your faith also in vain", says the Apostole Paul. (1 Cor 15:14). If it is really so, then all in Christianity depends on the question: how can we believe it? None of us saw the Resurrected, didn't touch His hand, His side pierced by a spear, however, it is this faith that is told about, "Blessed are they who didn't see, and yet believed" (John 20:29). So, how shall we believe? To rely on the experience of other people, on what the Church teaches us? Yes, surely, but still it's not our, my faith yet. And meanwhile we always told that any knowledge is based on evidence, we are always taught that in essence the Doubting Thomas was right refusing to believe without evidence, without touching. And the Lord Himself didn't condemn him, He suggested that Thomas believed the reality of His presence by touching Him. And still the Lord says, "Blessed are they who didn't see, and yet believed" (John, 20,29).

COUNTING OUR BLESSINGS ... News from Pastoral Care

Today you will notice Father Bo and Deacon blessing the Prayer Shawls as they do every 4th Sunday of the month. Today we have an addition to the program, Prayer Squares.

These are smaller and can be tucked discreetly in a pocket or placed under a pillow. Like prayer shawls, prayer squares are knitted or crocheted by volunteers who pray for the persons who will eventually receive them. That is the reason they are called prayers squares.

They are brought to church on the 4th Sunday of the month and placed beneath the icon of St. Stephen where they are blessed by Father. Then they are stored along with presentation bags and notes to recipients explaining what they are. The craft persons have requested that they remain anonymous. The making of a shawl or square is a prayerful act of love for an unknown person - as the person touches it he is reminded that he has been prayed for even if at that moment he is not able to pray for himself.

Anyone can receive: they don't have to be from St Stephen's, Ukrainian, Catholic, or even Christian. They are for everyone: women, men, and children. They are often given to people who are unwell but they are also nice for women expecting their first baby, for young people moving away from home, for someone lonely, fearful, or grieving. They carry with them prayers, comfort, and reassurance. Anyone can request a shawl or square for themselves or for someone else. Sometimes people pass their prayer shawl on to someone else in distress and come back to get another one for themselves.




Social Mission Weekend is coming up! April 28-30 at Camp Oselia

This will be a jam-packed weekend! 
