



MORE ROMA CHRONICLES ... Update from Father Mark

Rome is the BLACK HOLE of the universe when it comes to diversity! At least, that's the way I'd put it. The city attracts everyone and everything. I've been here now three months plus a week, and have taken in the churches, people, academics and street culture in a way not possible with a simple tour. Twenty minutes away I met a group of jazz musicians - accordion and bass player jammin' in front of Santa Maria Church!



Academics: Professor Dr. Fr. Robert Gahl teaches bioethics, with a particular specialization to the human brain and cybernetics. See a power point slide from his class. If you have a hard time understanding it, welcome to the club. We're still trying to figure it out. But his point was that there are exciting developments in the study of ethics and understanding what goes on in the brain. Tools now exist to measure, in real-time. the chemical reactions in our heads when faced with important decisions, with the possibility of eliminating bad decisions. Absolutely fascinating, as were the other classes on St. Paul and the letter to the Romans, Women Mystics in the church, Causes for the Declaration of Saints, Imagination in Pastoral Preaching, Gifts of the Holy Spirit, and much more. I've been very impressed with the presenters. They are the "heavyweights" of academic circles.



People: The poor of Rome are not forgotten, though many beggars shuffle through the popular streets. If you wear a cassock they will come over from three blocks away with arms outstretched. We've been warned not to support the "professional beggars." But I have taken a few to the nearby McDonalds for a meal, even though help is readily available from shelters nearby the Basilica of San Pietro.

Street Culture and Music: At my favourite cappuccino shop only one block away from the Vatican, an accordion player did his best to entertain the crowd - by playing "Beer Barrel Polka and then music from the "Godfather" movie. Well, how can you top that? I will freely admit this has been my most surreal experience in Rome.



Churches: St Stephen Protomartyr, our church patron, is buried in a tomb at the Basilica of Saint Lawrence outside the Walls. His story, you will recall, is mentioned in the Book of Acts chapter eight. This picture shows his title, "Protomartiris", just above the entrance to his tomb, shared with St. Lawrence. According to the Golden Legend, the relics of Lawrence - placed a few hundred years earlier - moved miraculously to one side to make room for those of Stephen. I was very proud to tell my brother priests about our parish of St. Stephen Protomartyr, and how we are cooking with gas in our diverse ministries, liturgies, and personalities.

Vergine Immaculata, aiutateche! Virgin Mary, help us!
