Epistle

1 Corinthians 15:1-11

rothers and Sisters, I would remind you of the good news that I proclaimed to you, which you in turn received, in which also you stand, through which also you are being saved, if you hold firmly to the message that I proclaimed to you-unless you have come to believe in vain. For I handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, and that he was buried, and that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers and sisters at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. For I am the least of the apostles, unfit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me has not been in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them—though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. Whether then it was I or they, so we proclaim and so you have come to believe

t that time, a young man came to Jesus and said, "Teacher, what good deed must I do to have eternal life?" And he said to him, "Why do you ask me about what is good? There is only one who is good. If you wish to enter into life, keep the commandments." He said to him, "Which ones?" And Jesus said, "You shall not murder; You shall not commit adultery; You shall not steal; You shall not bear false witness; Honor your father and mother; also, You shall love your neighbor as yourself." The young man said to him, "I have kept all these; what do I still lack?" Jesus said to him, "If you wish to be perfect, go, sell your possessions, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." When the young man heard this word, he went away grieving, for he had many possessions. 
Clothing Collection Shared with Calgary Families

onspiracy theories abound. If you delight in a wall of weird, from a religious point of view, it ranges from a false look-a-like pope presiding at the Second Vatican Council (instead of the real Pope Paul VI), to the real reason for the sinking of the Titanic being the newly-formed U.S Federal Reserve and the Jesuit Order of clergy. Though incredulous, these speculations should be eclipsed by real stories that are far more interesting, and edifying. Like the true story of a Catholic priest on the Titanic, Fr Thomas Byles. "When the Titanic began to sink on April 15, 1912, he had two opportunities to board a lifeboat. But he forewent those opportunities, according to passengers about the sinking ocean liner, in order to hear confessions and offer consolation and prayers with those who were trapped aboard ... Helen Mocklare, a third class passenger offered more details ... She recounted that a sailor "warned the priest of his danger and begged him to board a boat." Although the sailor was anxious to help him, the priest twice refused to leave. 'Be calm, my good people, he said' ... Fr Byles could have been saved, but he would not leave while one passenger was left ... after | got into the [life] boat, which was the last one to leave, and we were slowly going further away from the ship, I could hear distinctly the voice of the priest and the responses to his prayers" Pope Pius X, in a private audience with Fr Byles younger brother, declared him a martyr.

One of my professors during my sabbatical in Rome, Msgr. Robert Sarno, was for the past thirty-five years the leading cleric in the Congregation for the Cause of Saints. He told us the cause of canonization is simply, discernment of God's purpose for the church. There can not be enough saints! Some people simply stand out. The three criteria are: 1-martyrdom, or 2-heroic virtue, or 3-veneration by the faithful. When a miracle occurs that is attributed to that person's intervention, it is considered divine confirmation.

I am adding Fr Byles to my list of "adopted, unofficially declared" patron saints.

I just think heroic virtue and giving one's life for the sake of others has got to have a place in heaven.
