Epistle

1 Corinthians 1:10-18

BROTHERS AND SISTERS, I appeal to you by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you be in agreement and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same purpose. For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there are quarrels among you, my brothers and sisters. What I mean is that each of you says, "I belong to Paul," or "I belong to Apollos," or "I belong to Cephas," or "I belong to Christ." Has Christ been divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? I thank God that I baptized none of you except Crispus and Gaius, so that

no one can say that you were baptized in my name. (I did baptize also the household of Stephanas; beyond that, I do not know whether I baptized anyone else.) For Christ did not send me to baptize but to proclaim the gospel, and not with eloquent wisdom, so that the cross of Christ might not be emptied of its power. For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

Gospel

Matthew 14:14-22

t that time, , Jesus saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them and cured their sick. When it was evening, the disciples came to him and said, "This is a deserted place, and the hour is now late; send the crowds away so that they may go into the villages and buy food for themselves." Jesus said to them, "They need not go away; you give them something to eat." They replied, "We have nothing here but five loaves and two fish." And he said, "Bring them here to me." Then he ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven, and blessed and broke the loaves, and gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds. And all ate and were filled; and they took up what was left over of the broken pieces, twelve baskets full. And those who ate were about five thousand men, besides women and children. Immediately he made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds.

RELIGIOUS ART COMMITTEE REPORT JULY 2017

Since last October, we have been actively researching and contemplating the next piece of artwork to be installed, in conjunction with the celebration of the 50th Anniversary of the Parish. We wanted our icon choice to be a recognizable biblical story or parable to which most can relate. During this process, one of the committee members built a scale model of our church and we are now able to visualize the location of the future icons. This made it very clear to us that the lower level - the same as Our Lady of Pochaiv - would be the best location for any icons related to "family" and stories and parables from the bible. The future plan is to reserve the columns in the nave for "written-on-canvas" icons of the saints. The choice of the Religious Art Committee will be a mosaic depicting the biblical story of "The Sower", located on the north wall between the crying room windows and door to the sacristy, and is symbolically near the podium where the Epistle is read at every Divine Liturgy. -Jim Ochitwa, Religious Art Committee Chair

would like to thank the Religious Art Committee for their dedication, hard work, discussions, and prayers that led to the choosing of the Parable of the Sower - the next mosaic to be commissioned. It was exciting to be present at the meeting where we considered many possibilities and came to the same conclusions.

Over the years the parish have seen a development in the worship space of the church. I remember when Fr Peter Babej and I arrived at the parish in 2008, we sought to move the reader's stand away from the centre aisle to its present location. I also remember one day he invited me to come to the church and asked "see anything new?" When I replied that I did not, he pointed out the two side tables ~ the proskomedia (chalices rest on top) and diaconik (holy water, prayer shawls rest on top). He had positioned them directly in front of the large icon mosaics. I had not noticed! But it immediately seemed like the most suitable spot. Later changes were the two icons, Jesus and Mary, and then four icons, Jesus, Mary, St John the Baptizer, and St Nicholas the Wonderworker. (I personally like these icons very much and believe they add much to the sense of ritual and sacred space in church services.) Finally, I remember the meeting where approval by the Religious Art Committee was given for the Processional Cross and Repedia (Fans), fashioned and "written" by Fr Bohdan Nahachewsky. Very beautiful.

With all this in mind, I believe it is time to end the experiment of the current Candelabra, and return to the former six candles on the altar as before. (Nonetheless, I do accept all the theological explanations for a Candelabra, or "Menora" as otherwise called.) In the future and particularly after the 50th anniversary Mosaic of the Parable of the Sower is completed, I'll be asking the Religious Art Committee to once again look at the possibility of obtaining a Menora, looking at costs and possible donors, reviewing its importance in the wider sense of liturgical services and sacred worship space.
