Epistle

Ephesians 6:10 -17

A reading from the Epistle of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Ephesians:

rothers and Sisters, finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his power. Put on the whole armour of God, so that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For our struggle is not against enemies of blood and flesh, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers of this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. Therefore take up the whole armour of God, so that you may be able to withstand on that evil day, and having done everything, to stand firm. Stand therefore, and fasten the belt of truth around your waist, and put on the breastplate of righteousness. As shoes for

The Feast of the Conception by St. Anna (The Immaculate Conception)

On December 9th the Church celebrates the conception of our mostholy Lady, the Mother of God and ever-virgin Mary, the daughter of Sts. Joachim and Anna.

Anna, was from Bethlehem and was a descendant of the tribe of Levi. She was the youngest daughter of the priest Mathan and was married to Joachim, a descendant of the tribe of Judah. The marriage of Joachim and Anna was irregular according to the Mosaic Law of the Old Testament. They were of different tribes, and this had been forbidden so as not to confuse the lands and inheritances that had been apportioned to the Twelve Tribes of Israel.

After fifty years of marriage, Joachim and Anna remained childless. They lived devoutly and quietly, using only a third of their income for


themselves while giving a third to the poor and a third to the Temple. God so multiplied their flocks that the couple was well provided for.

When Joachim and Anna were in Jerusalem to offer sacrifice to God and submit their annual gift to the Temple, the High Priest, Issachar, reproached Joachim saying, "You are not worthy to offer sacrifice with those childless hands." Others also mocked Joachim, thrusting him back as unworthy. In despair, he consulted the records of the tribes of Israel and discovered every righteous man in the nation had been blessed with children, except him.

This caused the aged saint great grief, and he and his wife left the Temple Mount with heavy hearts. Anna fasted and prayed tearfully but humbly before God to have mercy on her, a barren and aged woman. Joachim also fasted and prayed for God's mercy. Joachim was with his flocks on a high mountain, and Anna in her garden, when God sent the Archangel Gabriel to each of them. God's messenger gave them tidings of the birth of "a daughter most blessed, by whom all the nations of the earth will be blessed, and through whom will come the salvation of the world."

Awed by the Archangel's appearance and message, each promised to raise their child raised in the Temple as a holy vessel of God. Gabriel directed Joachim to return home, where he would find his wife waiting for him in the city gate. Anna was likewise told by the Archangel to await at the gate. When they saw one another, they embraced, and this image is the traditional icon of this feast.




This challenging and engaging youth pilgrimage across the Western Prairie Provinces will be focusing on saints of our church over the past century.
