A reading from the Epistle of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Galatians:

rothers and Sisters, I want you to know that the gospel that was proclaimed by me is not of human origin; for I did not receive it from a human source, nor was I taught it, but I received it through a revelation of Jesus Christ. You have heard, no doubt, of my earlier life in Judaism. I was violently persecuting the church of God and was trying to destroy it. I advanced in Judaism beyond many among my people of the same age, for I was far more zealous for the traditions of my ancestors. This was to fulfil what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet, 'Out of Egypt I have called my son.' When Herod saw that he had been tricked by the wise men, he was infuriated, and he sent and killed all the children in and around Bethlehem who were two years old or under, according to the time that he had learned from the wise men. Then was fulfilled what had been spoken through the prophet Jeremiah: 'A voice was heard in Ramah, wailing and loud lamentation, Rachel weeping for her children; she refused to be consoled, because they are no more.' When Herod died, an angel of the Lord suddenly appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt and said, 'Get up, take the child and his mother, and go to the land of Israel, for those who were seeking the child's life are dead.' Then Joseph got up, took the child and his mother, and went to the land of Israel. But when he heard that Archelaus was ruling over Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there. And after being warned in a dream, he went away to the district of Galilee. There he made his home in a town called Nazareth, so that what had been spoken through the prophets might be fulfilled, 'He will be called a Nazorean.'

"Imagine no possessions, I wonder if you can, no need for greed or hunger, a brotherhood of man, imagine all the people sharing all the world ... You may say I'm a dreamer, but I'm not the only one. I hope someday you'll join us and the world will live as one." These words from the song "Imagine" by John Lennon enkindles a universal and yet unfulfilled desire for a peaceful existence here on earth. The composer was criticized for positing a world that centers itself too much on human experience, a community of humanity that is free from all "outside" influence, a utopian world where we are just plain old happy to coexist without encumbrance. Given the world Lennon lived in in the 1960's and 70's where religious intolerance, racial tension and global conflicts ruled the day you can see how he would feel this way. Then again how little has changed today. Yet, imagine a world where all peoples can live as one, free from partition and hatred, free from injustice and prejudice, free from unconstrained rivalry and pride, where there is peace on earth and good-will to all. Those last words should sound familiar.

The desire for a better world is just as alive today as it was then but how are we to achieve it? Well, quite frankly by ourselves we can't because we need a role model to follow. In Lennon's dream we need to free the world from our competitiveness and self-centeredness. He believed that religious bickering and nationalism were the core causes of division and therefore we should get rid of them altogether. In a nuanced way that is what the Catholic Church believes as well but by offering a model for us to follow. The Church in its catholicity (universality) is a call to all humanity (the brotherhood of man) no matter what race or nationality to be open to the presence of the Divine, that Guiding-Principle that we all have

in common. Not as an idea but as a person. A Rabbi from Nazareth who taught respect, dignity and love for all who did not start yet another a religion but rather was the fulfillment of religion itself. That may sound divisive in itself but how much better this world would be if we would just pay attention to the revolutionary teaching of Jesus Christ, to simply love one another as He has loved us.

May the love of God reign in your hearts for ever, may the peace of Emmanuel (God-with-us), born in Bethlehem of Judea, bring joy to your soul and may God's generous and ever-flowing Good-Will be experienced and shared by all each and every day of our lives.


