HOME BLESSING

Home blessings are now under way in this period of the Feast of Jordan. If you would like your home blessed you can contact us in one of 3 ways:

- 1) Enter your name and contact information onto the sign-up sheet at the entrance of the church,

The usual Jordan blessing takes about 10 minutes. If you would like to arrange for a longer visit to talk about faith that is possible as well. Remember to prepare for the blessing by bringing out your family Bible, a candle, and a container of holy water.

YOUTH AT ST. STEPHEN'S

Before we can begin to talk about trying to re-establish a teen youth program in our parish, we need to look at the question "What is the purpose of the Church?"

The Mission Statement of our Eparchial Church (Ukr. Catholics in Alberta) is the following: **"To lead people into an ever-closer communion with the Trinity** by together living out the Gospel of Jesus Christ and the teaching[s] and spirituality of the Ukrainian Catholic Church." Ultimately we recognize

that all people are created for unity with God, and that this unity is achieved through journeying spiritually together as taught by Christ and lead by the Holy Spirit.
 So... why do we need a youth program? Because youth are people. Not just the adults of the future, but people of the present who are called to be in communion with God and His Church now.
 his winter and spring, in addition to our exciting costumed medieval themed adventure “Kingdom Quest” for our Elementary aged children (which teens are welcome to help with if they wish), we are planning the following events for our teens.

Tuesday, February 6:	Angry Birds Live! (fun and games) Think of this: We build a castle, then we knock it down with a big indoor cata-pult. Rinse, and repeat. Then when we are tired of knocking down inanimate objects, we have a huge indoor snowball (sock) fight. With pizza and a short meeting to explain the rest of the year’s plan, this evening will be loads of fun.
Friday, February 23 – Sunday, February 25 (transportation to and from provided)	ThinkFast in Edmonton (social justice) Can you make a difference in this world? Can we ease the burden on the poorest of our planet? Do we even know what it is like to be poor and hungry? Join us for this incredible program put together by the Catholic Bishops of Canada where we will learn, play and fast from food for 25 hours with teens from across our province.
Thursday, March 8	Mini-Golf (fun and games) We will turn our fabulous two story facility into a “Putt and Bounce” like the world has never seen before. Obstacles, prizes, competitions, food and more. This indoor church tournament will knock your socks off! Oh yeah, and we will be collecting socks for those in need too.
Friday, March 23 – Sunday, March 25 (transportation to and from provided)	Teen Eparchial Lenten Retreat (spiritual retreat) We will be driving up to Camp Oselia to join other youth from around our prov-ince to pray and grow together before Holy Week and Easter. This profound spiritual experience is designed to not only let you be with other youth, but also to journey deep inside yourself and high up with Christ our Lord.
Thursday, April 13	Pizza and a Movie (fun and games) Okay, we have not planned this one out much. More details to come.
Saturday, April 21	The Great Game Show & Spaghetti Fundraiser! (fundraiser) In order to raise some funds for the pilgrimage (see below) we will be putting on an incredible exciting live Game Show and spaghetti fundraiser. Men’s Night will seem amateur when everyone get’s a load of our event!
Saturday, May 12	Preparing for the Pilgrimage (work-bee & meeting) There are a lot of details when planning a trip across the prairie provinces. We will be packing supplies, getting ready for on-bus entertainment, inform our-selves about the various stops we will be making, and the other youth from oth-er cities that we will be meeting.
Friday May 18 - Mon-day, May 21 (transportation to and from provided)	“Pilgrimage of the Saints” (youth pilgrimage) Four awesome days of journeying. We will begin in Calgary, go through Edmon-ton (where we will pick up other teen pilgrims), Vegreville, Saskatoon, and finally Winnipeg, and return through Regina back to Calgary. In each of these locations we will encounter saints of the past 100 years, and local youth that will play and pray with us. This journey will change your life.

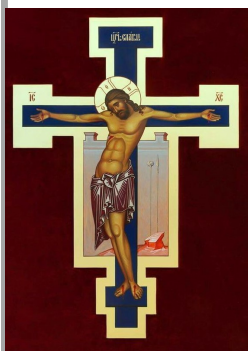
