#### Troparia and Kontakia

Troparion: Let the heavens be glad, let the earth rejoice,\* for the Lord has done a mighty deed with His arm.\* He trampled death by death. He became the first-born of the dead;\* He saved us from the abyss of Hades\* and granted great mercy to the world.

Troparion: The divine Church rejoices\* and the whole world keeps feast with radiance\* at the transfer of your relics, O venerable hierarch John Chrysostom.\* Your life as a bishop was godly\* and you willingly became a martyr.\* Therefore we cry to you, O martyr, passion-bearer and hierarchs' companion:\* Pray to Christ God that our souls may be saved.

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit.

Kontakion: You rose from the tomb, O compassionate Lord,\* and led us out from the gates of death.\* Today Adam exults and Eve rejoices,\* and the prophets together with the patriarchs\* unceasingly acclaim the divine might of Your power.

Now and for ever and ever. Amen.

Kontakion: The precious Church rejoices mystically\* at the transfer of your holy relics\* and treasuring them as costly gold\* it lavishly grants to those who hymn you the grace of healing,\* by your prayers, O John the Goldenmouthed.






#### Donations for the Men's Dinner:
