Troparia and Kontakia

Troparion: Angelic powers were upon Your tomb* and the guards became like dead men;* Mary stood before Your tomb* seeking Your most pure body.* You captured Hades without being overcome by it.* You met the Virgin and granted life.* O Lord, risen from the dead,* glory be to You!

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit.

Kontakion: With His life-giving hand* Christ our God, the Giver of life,* raised all the dead from the murky abyss* and bestowed resurrection upon humanity.* He is for all the Saviour,* the resurrection and the life, and the God of all.

Now and for ever and ever. Amen.

Theotokion: Undaunted patroness of Christians,* O steadfast intermediary with the Creator,* turn not away from the suppliant voices of sinners,* but in your kindness come to help us who cry out to you in faith.* Be quick to intercede, make haste to plead,* for you are ever the patroness of those who honour you, O Mother of God.

Prokeimenon: Save Your people, O Lord, * and bless Your inheritance.

verse: Unto You I will cry, O Lord, my God, lest You turn from me in silence.

Epistle: A reading from the Second Epistle of the holy Apostle Paul to the Corinthians

Brothers and Sisters, it is the God who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

But we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us. We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be made visible in our bodies. For while we live, we are always being given up to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of

Jesus may be made visible in our mortal flesh. So death is at work in us, but life in you.

But just as we have the same spirit of faith that is in accordance with scripture — "I believed, and so I spoke"—we also believe, and so we speak, because we know that the one who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus, and will bring us with you into his presence. Yes, everything is for your sake, so that grace, as it extends to more and more people, may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God. (2 Corinthians 4:6-15)

Alleluia: He who lives in the aid of the Most High, shall dwell under the protection of the God of heaven.

verse: He says to the Lord: You are my protector and my refuge, my God, in Whom I hope.

Gospel: Matthew 22:35-46

At that time, a lawyer, asked Jesus a question to test him. "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" He said to him, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets."

Now while the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus asked them this question: "What do you think of the Messiah? Whose son is he?" They said to him, "The son of David." He said to them, "How is it then that David by the Spirit calls him Lord, saying,

'The Lord said to my Lord, "Sit at my right hand, until I put your enemies under your feet"?

If David thus calls him Lord, how can he be his son?" No one was able to give him an answer, nor from that day did anyone dare to ask him any more questions.

OPERATION ST. NICHOLAS 2019

Gifts for Orphans and Children in Ukraine in the Care of the Sisters Servants of Mary Immaculate



This year our Parish has an opportunity to support the Sister Servants of Mary Immaculate SSMI in Ukraine with their work around disadvantaged children.

The sisters provide support and assistance to over 250 children in an around L'viv. There are children from two large families (8 and 7 children) and a few are handicapped. The Sisters provide before and after school care while the child's caregiver (typically a single-mom or grandmother) is out working. They also provide for the spiritual and cultural needs of children, many of them neglected, and they assist families with material needs such as clothing and medications.

UCWLC and St Stephen's Parish will be making Christmas a special occasion 25 of these children and their families who come from 'Chervonohrad', a mining city 62 km north of L'viv. We are asking donations to fill backpacks, provided by UCWLC, for each of the 25 children. The Sisters have specifically asked for gifts of school supplies, hygiene products and clothing, with ages ranging between 1 and 8 years

old. A <u>list of suggested gift items</u> will be handed out with each child's name and age, alternatively you can purchase individual items from the list to be added to backpacks. The total gift bags should range between \$15 and \$25.

Anyone wishing to make a cash donation will receive a tax receipt (cheques payable to St. Stephen's Parish). These funds are used to purchase any gift items required as well as pay for the shipment to Ukraine. Money will also be sent to the SSMI who can purchase supplies and food for each family to make Christmas special for the children and their families.






