Troparia and Kontakia

Troparion: Let the heavens be glad, let the earth rejoice,* for the Lord has done a mighty deed with His arm.* He trampled death by death. He became the first-born of the dead;* He saved us from the abyss of Hades* and granted great mercy to the world.

Troparion: In giving birth you retained your virginity,* in falling asleep you did not abandon the world, O Mother of God.* You passed into life, for you are the Mother of Life,* and by your prayers* you deliver our souls from death.

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit.

Kontakion: You rose from the tomb, O compassionate Lord,* and led us out from the gates of death.* Today Adam exults and Eve rejoices,* and the prophets together with the patriarchs* unceasingly acclaim the divine might of Your power.

Now and for ever and ever. Amen.

Kontakion: The tomb and death could not hold the Mother of God,* unceasing in her intercession and unfailing hope of patronage,* for, as the Mother of Life, she was transferred to life* by Him Who had dwelt in her ever-virgin womb.

Prokeimenon: Sing to our God, sing;* sing to our King, sing. verse: Clap your hands, all you nations;* shout

unto God with the voice of joy.

Prokeimenon: My soul magnifies the Lord,* and my spirit has rejoiced in God my Saviour.

Epistle: A reading from the First Epistle of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Corinthians. Brothers and Sisters, I would remind you of the good news that I proclaimed to you, which you in turn received, in which also you stand, through which also you are being saved, if you hold firmly to the message that I proclaimed to you—unless you have come to believe in vain.

For I handed on to you as of first importance

what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, and that he was buried, and that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers and sisters at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. For I am the least of the apostles, unfit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me has not been in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them-though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. Whether then it was I or they, so we proclaim and so you have come to believe. (1 Corinthians 15:1-11)

Alleluia: In You, O Lord, have I hoped that I may not be put to shame for ever. verse: Be a protector unto me, O God, and a house of refuge to save me.

Gospel: Matthew 19:16-26

At that time, a young man came to Jesus and said, "Teacher, what good deed must I do to have eternal life?" And he said to him, "Why do you ask me about what is good? There is only one who is good. If you wish to enter into life, keep the commandments." He said to him, "Which ones?" And Jesus said, "You shall not murder; You shall not commit adultery; You shall not steal; You shall not bear false witness; Honor your father and mother; also, You shall love your neighbor as yourself." The young man said to him, "I have kept all these; what do I still lack?" Jesus said to him, "If you wish to be perfect, go, sell your possessions, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." When the young man heard this word, he went away grieving, for he had many possessions.

Then Jesus said to his disciples, "Truly I tell you, it will be hard for a rich person to enter the kingdom of heaven. Again I tell you, it is easier

ADULT/YOUTH UKRAINIAN LANGUAGE ONLINE CLASSES 2020 FALL

Ukrainian language classes via Zoom for adults and youth (at least 12 years of age, preferably together with a parent) for the fall semester, 2020:

Beginner - For those who have no or very limited knowledge of the Ukrainian language. Class time will be distributed evenly among reading, conversation and grammar. Students will learn to read the Cyrillic alphabet.

Wednesday evenings, commencing Sept 16, 2020: 7:45 – 9:00 pm

Level II - This class will focus on learning vocabulary for common everyday situations, and continuing to study grammar concepts. Students will also learn phrases for self-introduction and simple conversation. Registrants should be familiar with the Ukrainian alphabet and have some vocabulary.

Level III - For more advanced students who have studied the Ukrainian

St. Stephen's Ukrainian Catholic Church is sponsoring on-line language and grammar for several years, and may have learned some Ukrainian in childhood. About 50% of the class-time is Ukrainian conversation.
