Epistle

Hebrews 4:14-5:6

Brothers and sisters, seeing then that we have a great High Priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast *our* confession. For we do not have a High Priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but was in all *points* tempted as *we are*, yet without sin. Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

For every high priest taken from among men is appointed for men in things *pertaining* to God, that he may offer both gifts and sacrifices for sins. He can have compassion on those who are ignorant and going astray, since he himself is also subject to weakness. Because of this he is required as for the people, so also for himself, to offer *sacrifices* for sins. And no man takes this

honor to himself, but he who is called by God, just as Aaron was.

So also Christ did not glorify Himself to become High Priest, but *it was* He who said to Him:

"You are My Son, Today I have begotten You."

As *He* also says in another *place*:

"You *are* a priest forever, According to the order of Melchizedek."

For whoever is ashamed of Me and My words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of him the Son of Man also will be ashamed when He comes in the glory of His Father with the holy angels."

Effective January 18th, 2021 and as per the Provincial mandate, we are now restricting the amount of people in the church to 50 for our regular Divine Liturgies.

St. Stephen's parish will strictly adhere to these new measures outlined in detail below.

- Two-meter physical distancing between households must be maintained
- Mask use is mandatory unless you have a medical exemption. Those choosing not to wear a mask will not be permitted to enter the church for the safety of other parishioners.
- Hand-sanitizing at entrance/exit to church is required.
- The faithful are required to sign-in upon entry for tracking purposes should someone present as COVID-19 positive.
- Ushers are to remind the faithful of the above requirements.
- Recited liturgies are encouraged. **Where singing is practiced, no congregational singing. Rather, a single cantor may lead the responses, while the faithful remain prayerfully silent.**
- Online liturgical services are encouraged
- In-person faith group meetings can continue but physical distancing and public health measures must be followed
- **Receptions are not permitted**
- **Maximum of 10 people for weddings and baptisms and 20 people for funerals**
 - This includes the officiant, bride/groom, and witnesses
 - This does not include staff or organizers who are not considered an invited guest
 - This applies to any facility, including places of worship and funeral homes.
 - This includes services held indoors or outdoors, seated or non-seated.

REFLECTION

THE THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT is dedicated to the Cross. The reason for this is given to us in the Synaxarion for the day:

On this third Sunday of the Great Fast we celebrate the Veneration of the precious and life-giving Cross. Since during the forty days of the Fast we are also in a way crucified, mortified to the passions, contrite, abased and despondent, the precious and life-giving Cross is offered to us as refreshment and confirmation, calling to mind the Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ and comforting us.... Just as those who have traveled a long hard road, weighed down by the labors of their journey, in finding a shady tree, take their ease for a moment and continue their journey rejuvenated, so now in this time of the Fast, this sorrowful and laborious journey, the Holy Fathers have planted the life-giving Cross before us, for our relief and refreshment, to encourage and make easier the labors that lie ahead.

It is clear, then, that the Sunday of the Veneration of the Cross is directly connected to our Lenten effort. If we have taken Lent seriously so far, by now we are probably feeling the strain of this effort. Our fasting is perhaps becoming harder to maintain, our acts of charity are perhaps dwindling or growing cold, sloth may be persuading us to stay at home rather than attend the evening Lenten services. We may be missing the worldly things in our lives that we may have chosen to cut back on or cut out altogether during Lent. And so the Cross is placed before us to remind us of the suffering Christ endured for us.

Furthermore, this day reminds us not only of the Cross but also of the Resurrection—the ultimate goal of our ascetic struggle and of the Lenten season—Pascha. The theme-hymns, or *hirmoi*, for this day all make reference to the Resurrection, and the canon for the day is chanted according to exactly the same melody as the canon of Pascha. Thus the Church reminds us, not only in words but even through melody, that Lent is the necessary journey to Pascha, and we cannot reach the joy of the Resurrection without going through the Cross. And so we hear in the Gospel reading for this day the words of our Lord: “If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow Me” (Matt. 16:24).

The Cross and Resurrection are not to be seen in isolation. From the moment we see the Cross, we see also the impending Resurrection. Thus the Cross is a symbol not of sorrow, but of joyful expectation. As we say at every Sunday Matins service:

Having seen the Resurrection of Christ, let us worship the Holy Lord Jesus, the only sinless one. We worship Your Cross, O Christ, and we praise and glorify Your holy Resurrection. For You are our God; we know no other but You; we name You by name. Come, all the faithful, let us worship the holy Resurrection of Christ; for behold, through the Cross, joy has come into all the world. Ever blessing the Lord, we sing His Resurrection. For having endured the Cross for us, by death He has destroyed death. (Prayer after the reading of the Sunday Matins Gospel)

Having thus been encouraged and inspired by the memory and veneration of the Cross on which Christ suffered for our sakes, we are persuaded to continue our own Lenten effort, to carry on bearing our cross for His sake, and to walk with our Lord to Calvary, that we may truly participate in the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Christ. Only then, having followed Christ throughout the Lenten journey into Holy Week, will we truly be able to participate in the joy of His life-giving Resurrection.



At every ordination, whether it be to the subdiaconate, diaconate or priesthood, the man receiving Holy Orders is configured to Christ in a unique way by the Holy Spirit. As part of the ordination rite he is presented with the tools and vestments of his office, and the bishop proclaims “*Axios!*” (“he is worthy” in Greek) to which the people add their acclamation with a resounding and thrice repeated *Axios!*

Yet, brothers and sisters, in a certain sense we are wrong every time. No one is truly worthy to stand before the Lord. All have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God. St. Paul reminds us that in fact, the failings and weakness of the Levitical priests of the Old Covenant allowed them to act with compassion and mercy towards those who they are interceding for. In a similar way we can take confidence in the perfect High Priesthood of Christ. Our Lord was tested in every way that we are. Just like us, He was not above temptation as a man, but unlike us He did not succumb, meaning that He is the perfect High Priest who is seated in glory on the right hand of His Father.

This is the amazing mystery of the Christian priesthood. We are unworthy, and yet the Lord has made us worthy and is continuing to make us worthy. With this in mind let us continue to take joy and security from the fact that our Heavenly Father has not left us orphans, but has called men out of the world to intercede for us, and at the same time let us keep our clergy in prayer that they may remain open to Divine Grace in their ministry.

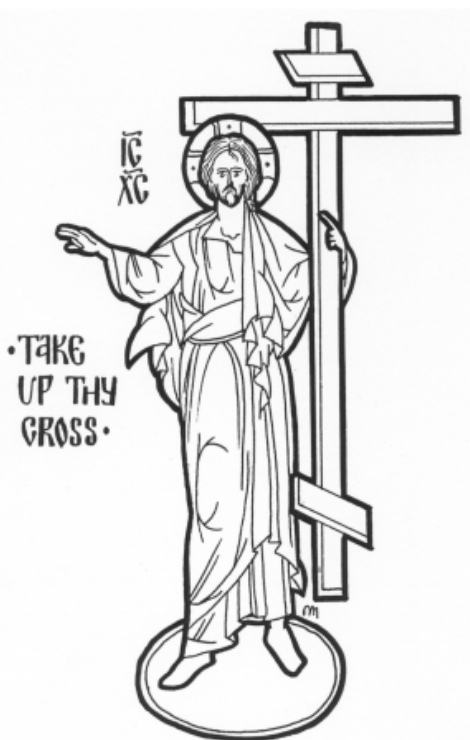
FOLLOW JESUS
