

Gospel

Six days before the Passover, Jesus came to Bethany, where Lazarus was who had been dead, whom He had raised from the dead. There they made Him a supper; and Martha served, but Lazarus was one of those who sat at the table with Him. Then Mary took a pound of very costly oil of spikenard, anointed the feet of Jesus, and wiped His feet with her hair. And the house was filled with the fragrance of the oil.

But one of His disciples, Judas Iscariot, Simon's *son*, who would betray Him, said, "Why was this fragrant oil not sold for three hundred denarii and given to the poor?" This he said, not that he cared

for the poor, but because he was a thief, and had the money box; and he used to take what was put in it.

But Jesus said, "Let her alone; she has kept this for the day of My burial. For the poor you have with you always, but Me you do not have always."

Now a great many of the Jews knew that He was there; and they came, not for Jesus' sake only, but that they might also see Lazarus, whom He had raised from the dead. But the chief priests plotted to put Lazarus to death also, because on account of him many of the Jews went away and believed in Jesus.

The next day a great multitude that had come to the feast, when they heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem, took branches of palm trees and went out to meet Him, and cried out:

"Hosanna!

'Blessed *is* He who comes in the name of the LORD!' The King of Israel!"

Then Jesus, when He had found a young donkey, sat on it; as it is written:

"Fear not, daughter of Zion; Behold, your King is coming, Sitting on a donkey's colt."

His disciples did not understand these things at first; but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things were written about Him and *that* they had done these things to Him.

Therefore the people, who were with Him when He called Lazarus out of his tomb and raised him from the dead, bore witness. For this reason the people also met Him, because they heard that He had done this sign.

Not of This World Palm Sunday

The Word of God the Father, the Son who is co-eternal with Him, whose throne is Heaven and whose footstool is the earth, has today humbled Himself, coming to Bethany on a dumb colt. Wherefore, the Hebrew children praised Him, carrying in their hands branches, and crying: Blessed is He who comes, the King of Israel. (Vespers of the Feast, third hymn of the stichera)

"If My kingdom were of this world, My servants would fight" (John 18:36). So said our Lord to Pontius Pilate when he asked Him, "Are you a king?" Kingdoms are built with violence, oppression, and mammon. Christ's Kingdom is bestowed upon us through His self-sacrifice, humility, and poverty. His Kingdom is one that triumphs over death and evil. It is this triumph the people of Israel celebrated when our Lord entered Jerusalem after raising Lazarus from the dead when he had been four days in the grave. The Lord enters Jerusalem not on a chariot, with pride and pomp, rejoicing in the vanguishing of human enemies; He enters on a donkey, in humility, having vanguished death itself.

This double feast—the raising of Lazarus and our Lord's humble entry into Jerusalem a week before His own Resurrection—is what we celebrate at the threshold of Holy Week on Lazarus Saturday and Palm Sunday:

O Christ God, when You raised Lazarus from the dead, before Your Passion, You confirmed the universal resurrection. Wherefore, like the children, we carry the insignia of triumph and victory, and cry out to You, O Vanquisher of death: Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is He who comes in the Name of the Lord. (Apolytikion for Lazarus Saturday)

Give praise with one accord, O peoples and nations, for the King of the angels rides now upon a foal, and He comes to smite His enemies with the Cross in His almighty power. Therefore the children sing to Him with palms in their hands: Glory to You who have come as Conqueror! Glory to You, O Christ the Savior! Glory to You, our God, for You alone are blessed!" (Matins of the Feast, second kathisma)

The One who has power over death will hand Himself over to death that we may partake in His Resurrection—not merely a raising of the body from death, as was the case with Lazarus, but a new body that has been freed from our fallen condition and refashioned in the image and likeness of the God who took on the image and likeness of man:

Let us come with branches to praise Christ the Master in faith like babies, purifying our souls and crying to Him with a loud voice: Blessed are You, O Savior, who came into the world and became a new, spiritual Adam from the first curse, and prepared all things for the best. O Word and lover of mankind, glory to You! (Matins of the Feast, first kathisma)

Mankind is committed to the pursuit of power, wealth, and conquest, but on Palm Sunday we are reminded that the weakness of God is greater than the strength of man (see 1 Cor. 1:25). All empires will fall, all conquests will fade, all wealth will dissolve, all flesh will return to the dust. And here comes one who having nothing, possesses all things (see 2 Cor. 6:10). He is our Lord and Master and Creator, and He comes on a donkey to proclaim the establishment of His everlasting Kingdom. Many expected the Messiah to be a vanquisher of the Romans, a mighty king of earthly power, charging Jerusalem on a steed with an army of tens of thousands. What a disappointment to see their hope of liberation arrive in such a ridiculous manner! But how profound that He should arrive in this way. What a powerful statement on the futility of human conquest.

Christ comes to vanquish death and to reverse the error of Adam. In this campaign for true liberation and conquest, the only blood that will be shed is His own, and so He enters Jerusalem not on a charger, but on a lowly animal bearing Him to His humiliating death. Christ comes to restore man to his full dignity by relinquishing His own divine dignity to human oppressors. Thus the celebration of Lazarus Saturday and Palm Sunday remains with us throughout Holy Week when we remember and relive our Lord's suffering and death—a celebration that will find fulfillment at Pascha, when we hear and proclaim the joyful news and announcement of true freedom and victory:

Christ has risen from the dead. By death He has trampled upon death, and to those in the tombs He has given life! (Apolytikion of Pascha)




