the Holy Apostle and Evangelist Mark (54-68)

After the priest has exclaimed, Blessed be the Kingdom... and the people have responded, Amen, the clergy sing the Paschal Troparion once and the people repeat it. Then, the clergy sing the first half, and the people conclude it.

Paschal Troparion

Christ is risen from the dead,* trampling death by death,* and to those in the tombs* giving life.

Troparia and Kontakia

Troparion, Tone 3: Let the heavens be glad, let the earth rejoice,* for the Lord has done a mighty deed with His arm.* He trampled death by death. He became the first-born of the dead;* He saved us from the abyss of Hades* and granted great mercy to the world.

Troparion, Tone 3: Learning from Peter the chief apostle* you too became an apostle of Christ,* and shone on various lands like the sun.* O blessed one, adornment of Alexandrians,* through you Egypt was freed from deceit.* For you are a pillar of light for the Church* enlightening all with your teaching of the Good News.* Therefore, we feast your memorial, O Mark, divinely inspired.* Ask God whom you preached to all to grant our souls forgiveness of sins.

Kontakion, Tone 2: You received from on high the grace of the Spirit,* and destroyed the snares of the orators,* O Mark, most glorious apostle.* You caught the nations and brought them to the Master* by preaching to them the divine Good News

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

Kontakion, Tone 3: Lord, as of old You raised the Paralytic,* lift my soul by Your divine presence,* for by many sins and foolish actions,* I, too, am now afflicted and crippled.* Raise me, that being saved I may cry to You:* Glory to Your power, O merciful Christ.

Now and for ever and ever. Amen.

Kontakion, Tone 8: Though You descended into a tomb, O Immortal One,* yet You destroyed the power of Hades;* and You rose as victor, O Christ God,* calling to the myrrh-bearing women: Rejoice!* and giving peace to Your Apostles:* You, who grant Resurrection to the fallen.

In those days, as Peter went through all parts of the country, that he also came down to the saints who dwelt in Lydda. There he found a certain man named Aeneas, who had been bedridden eight years and was paralyzed. And Peter said to him, "Aeneas, Jesus the Christ heals you. Arise and make your bed." Then he arose immediately. So all who dwelt at Lydda and Sharon saw him and turned to the Lord.

At Joppa there was a certain disciple named Tabitha, which is translated Dorcas. This woman was full of good works and charitable deeds which she did. But it happened in those days that she became sick and died. When they had washed her, they laid her in an upper room. And since Lydda was near Joppa, and the disciples had heard that Peter was there, they sent two men to him, imploring him not to delay in coming to them. Then Peter arose and went with them. When he had come, they brought him to the upper room. And all the widows stood by him weeping, showing the tunics and garments which Dorcas had made while she was with them. But Peter put them all out, and knelt down and prayed. And turning to the body he said, "Tabitha, arise." And she opened her eyes, and when she saw Peter she sat up. Then he gave her his hand and lifted her up; and when he had called the saints and widows, he presented her alive. And it became known throughout all Joppa, and many believed on the Lord.



porches. In these lay a great multitude of sick people, blind, lame, paralyzed, waiting for the moving of the water. For an angel went down at a certain time into the pool and stirred up the water; then whoever stepped in first, after the stirring of the water, was made well of whatever disease he had. Now a certain man was there who had an infirmity thirty-eight years. When Jesus saw him lying there, and knew that he already had been in that condition a long time, He said to him, "Do you want to be made well?"

The sick man answered Him, "Sir, I have no man to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up; but while I am coming, another steps down before me."

Jesus said to him, "Rise, take up your bed and walk." And immediately the man was made well, took up his bed, and walked.

And that day was the Sabbath. The Jews therefore said to him who was cured, "It is the Sabbath; it is not lawful for you to carry your bed."

He answered them, "He who made me well said to me, 'Take up your bed and walk.'"

Then they asked him, "Who is the Man who said to you, 'Take up your bed and walk'?" But the one who was healed did not know who it was, for Jesus had withdrawn, a multitude being in *that* place. Afterward Jesus found him in the temple, and said to him, "See, you have been made well. Sin no more, lest a worse thing come upon you."

The man departed and told the Jews that it was Jesus who had made him well.

At the dismissal, instead of "Glory be to the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, now and forever and ever. Amen." we chant:

Christ is risen from the dead,* trampling death by death,* and to those in the tombs* giving life.

After the final Amen, the Troparion "Christ is risen" is sung as at the beginning of the Liturgy, but with the addition:

And to us He has granted life eternal;* we bow down before His resurrection on the third day.

When was the last time you saw a Cop movie, either in the theater or through streaming media? These types of movies remain the favourite genre of many in that we love heroes, and we are inspired by standing up to injustice and protecting the innocent.

I have always found it unfortunate that the classic motto "To serve and protect" has been moved away from by many police divisions in an attempt to recruit people who are seeking a more "interesting or engaging" line of work. But either way, police movies continue to endure year in and year out. We need justice.

These movies invariably featuring a situation where the hotshot officer has a choice to make: go in alone, or wait for backup. As much as we require justice, we are also mastered many times by our own pride. Instead of relying on the strength of the Force behind them, these hotshots often "don't have time for backup" and so charge into the ominous building themselves!

Justice in the Gospel of John is different from what we might expect. The readers of the gospel already know the verdict: guilty! The world hates Christ and following Him means the world will hate and persecute us as well. In some cases, as our Lord tells His disciples, the world will go so far as to kill us, and this certainly was the case with all the disciples themselves (except John who died in exile). The point for us today is not that we will evade persecution and suffering, but that Christ will send backup!

We will not need to defend ourselves, or even Christ, on our own. The παράκλητος, the Paraclete, Advocate or Comforter will be sent to help and sustain us. The good news is not that we won't suffer as Christians, it is that if we are suffering for Christ and His Church, we will never suffer needlessly nor suffer alone!


April 23: Holy Great Martyr George



He was born possibly in Cappadocia and raised, on the death of his father, in Palestine. He became a soldier in the Roman army. Rather than deny Christ and swear by the pagan gods, he declared himself a Christian and was therefore arrested and tortured. He was finally martyred by beheading in Nicomedia. His defiance of the pagan Emperor's order and his zeal in confessing Christ brought great courage to others faced with martyrdom. He suffered for his Lord in the early fourth century. His life shows us how courage is necessary to overcome evil. As a martyr, he overcame the Evil One (who Scripture describes as a "great dragon") for the martyrs "overcame him by the blood of the Lamb and the Word of their testimony for they loved not their lives even unto death". King Richard the Lionheart of England and his crusaders brought back a great devotion to

St. George which they learned in the Holy Land so that St. George became the patron of England.

April 24: Holy Martyr Sabbas the General



He lived in Rome in the reign of Emperor Aurelian. He was of a Gothic family and was a general in the army. Though he kept his faith quietly, he did his best to help his fellow-Christians who had been charged and thrown into prison. When eventually discovered and charged with being a Christian, he did not deny the Faith but boldly confessed it, throwing down his military belt (the symbol of his soldier's office) at the Emperor's feet. He was martyred by drowning in the Tiber River in 272

Healing at the Pool of Bethesda

ave you ever wanted something very much and had to wait a long time for it? Maybe you wanted a new toy or a watch, or maybe you were sick for a long time and wanted to get well quickly. The man in our story today knew what it was to want something very badly and have to wait a long time for it.

esus has come to Jerusalem to attend a feast. Soon He finds Himself near a pool, the Pool of Bethesda. Five beautiful covered porches surround the pool. This is the kind of place that should be peaceful. It should be surrounded with lush green plants and colorful flowers. But it is a place of sickness and misery.

All around the pool, people are struggling. Sick people lie in all angles or sit hunched over. So many peoplel Jesus stops. He looks around. He sees the blind, the deaf, the crippled. He sees some with stomach problems and skin diseases. Some suffer from mental health problems. His heart goes out to the elderly, the children, and those of all ages in between.

All are here hoping for a miracle. The people wait for the water in the pool to move. Many believe it will be stirred by an angel. And whoever is first in the water afterward will be healed. Jesus knows that isn't true. It is a false hope, but the people wait and watch. And when ripples appear, the eager people rush forward. Desperate for healing, they trample the smaller or weaker.

Jesus looks over this crowd of sick people, and He has compassion on them. He wants to heal all of them! He knows some of the Jewish leaders would be angry if he healed the sick today, because it was the Sabbath. They would even try to kill Him. But His time has not come. His work on earth is not yet finished.

Jesus knows each person's name and their sickness. He especially notices one man who has been crippled for 38 years. Jesus also knows that the man is sad. He is lonely, and



feels that he is not worthy of God's mercy. Quietly Jesus kneels beside him and bends over to see his face. Tenderly He asks, "Do you want to be healed?"

Hope jumps in the man's heart. Of course he wants to be healed! Doesn't everyone here? He doesn't know who Jesus is. He doesn't know that Jesus can heal him. He believes his only hope is to get into that water. So he tells Jesus, "Sir, I don't have anyone to help me. I can't get into the pool fast enough. When I try, someone always gets in before me."

Jesus doesn't ask the man to believe in Him. He doesn't even tell the man who He is. He knows the man doesn't feel worthy of God's love. But Jesus wants to pour His grace out on this man. So He says to the man, "Get up! Pick up your bed and walk."

The man doesn't hesitate. He obeys. He wants to be made well. Nerves and muscles that haven't been useful for years are brought to life! The man jumps up! He rolls up his rug and blanket. Then he looks around for the One who just healed him. But Jesus has slipped away into the crowd.

Later Jesus meets the man in the temple. The man is overjoyed. And he tells everyone he meets the good news about Jesus.

That day Jesus healed a man's body. Jesus' healing grace also brought him back to God. With love Jesus says to us, 'Will you be healed?' He wants us to be healthy in body and spirit. He wants to pour out His grace on us too. Will you accept Him today and let Him be your Savior too?
