Glorify Your Son, that Your Son also may glorify You, as You have given Him authority over all flesh, that He should give eternal life to as many as You have given Him. And this is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent. I have glorified You on the earth. I have finished the work which You have given Me to do. And now, O Father, glorify Me together with Yourself, with the glory which I had with You before the world was.

"I have manifested Your name to the men whom You have given Me out of the world. They were

Yours, You gave them to Me, and they have kept Your word. Now they have known that all things which You have given Me are from You. - First Communion has been postponed.

A second chalice will always be prepared to distribution of Communion upstairs via the minor cleric. Please note that if you have already pre-registered for any upcoming Liturgy you will be contacted by the office to confirm attendance.
- Weekday Liturgies and Molebens are cancelled at this time with the exception of Ascension Thursday, May 13th at 9:00am. Parishioners may benefit from the livestreamed services being served at our Cathedral: <u>https://stjosaphat.ab.ca/</u>
- In an attempt to allow more people to participate in the Liturgy during these more strict restrictions, the 6 PM Saturday Vespers will become an evening liturgy. Please use the appropriate preregistration signups for the Liturgy. Confessions are cancelled during this time. Once these restrictions have lifted, we will return to Saturday evening Great Vespers at the same time.
- Those with medical conditions who are unable to wear a mask will be allowed to attend this week but they will need to obtain a medical exemption letter from a health professional if they are planning to attend in the upcoming weeks.



Divine Ascent

LEAVE-TAKING OF PASCHA AND ASCENSION THURSDAY

Pascha concludes with the Leave-taking of Pascha, when we again celebrate the Paschal liturgy, and for the last time we greet one another with the words, "Christ is risen!"—"Truly the Lord is risen!"

The following day, forty days after Pascha, we celebrate our Lord's Ascension into heaven. Some have come to think of this day as a sorrowful one, because the Lord is physically no longer present with us on earth but returns to the Father. But it is by no means a day of sorrow, for in ascending to the heavenly

Father, our Lord took with Him our human nature, which He assumed for our salvation. Because He shares in our humanity, we share in His divinity; because He became our brother, we are children of His Father:

"I am ascending to My Father and your Father, and *to* My God and your God." (John 20:17)

"I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself; that where I am, *there* you may be also." (John 14:2–3)

Because Christ took flesh, died, and rose in the body and raised it up to heaven, we are able to follow Him to God the Father:

When You came down from heaven to things on earth and as God raised up with You Adam's nature, which lay below in the prison of Hades, You brought it to heaven by Your Ascension, O Christ, and made it sit with You on Your Father's throne, for You are merciful and love mankind. (Matins of the Ascension, kathisma)

As St. Paul writes:

Now this, "He ascended"—what does it mean but that He also first descended into the lower parts of the earth? He who descended is also the One who ascended far above all the heavens, that He might fill all things. (Eph. 4:9–10)

Far from being a day of sorrow, the Ascension is a feast of joy and eager anticipation. We cannot think of the Ascension without remembering that Christ is returning to the Father to pour the Holy Spirit upon us:

You were taken up in glory, Christ our God, giving joy to Your Disciples by the promise of the Holy Spirit, when through the blessing they had been assured that You are the Son of God, the Redeemer of the world. (Apolytikion of the Ascension)

In ascending to heaven, O Lord, from where You also descended, do not leave us orphans; may Your Spirit come, bringing peace to the world; show to the sons of men Your powerful deeds, O Lord, for You love mankind. (Vespers for Ascension Thursday, first hymn of the aposticha)

As our Lord said:

"It is to your advantage that I go away; for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you; but if I depart, I will send Him to you." (John 16:7)

With Pentecost approaching, again we are reminded of baptism through the image of water in our church services. In the third Old Testament reading for the Vespers of the Ascension, we hear: Behold, the day of the LORD is coming,

And in that day His feet will stand on the Mount of Olives,

Which faces Jerusalem on the east.

And in that day it shall be That living waters shall flow from Jerusalem,

Half of them toward the eastern sea And half of them toward the western sea;

In both summer and winter it shall occur.

And the LORD shall be King over all the earth.

In that day it shall be-

"The LORD is one,"


And His name one. (Zech. 14:1, 4, 8–9)

While the Ascension invites us to strengthen our preparation for Pentecost, at the same time it reminds us strongly of our Lord's Second Coming:

Your angels, O Lord, said to Your Apostles: Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up to heaven? This is Christ our God, who is taken up from you into heaven; He will come again in the same way that you have seen Him going to heaven; serve Him in holiness and righteousness. (Vespers for Ascension Thursday, third hymn of the aposticha)

This double preparation characterizes the Feast of the Ascension: We prepare for the coming of the Holy Spirit while remembering also the Second Coming of Christ. Again, Pentecost and baptism are placed within the context of the last things. For through the Holy Spirit, we are given a fore-taste of the world to come. Therefore, the Church calls us always to be ready for the coming of the Lord.


