On the last day, that great day of the feast, Jesus stood and cried out, saying, “If anyone thirsts, let him come to Me and drink. He who believes in Me, as the Scripture has said, out of his heart will flow rivers of living water.” But this He spoke concerning the Spirit, whom those believing in Him would receive; for the Holy Spirit was not yet given, because Jesus was not yet glorified.

Therefore many from the crowd, when they heard this saying, said, “Truly this is the Prophet.” Others said, “This is the Christ.”

CORONA VIRUS COVID-19

- First Communion has been postponed.
- Funerals/Baptisms/Weddings are all down to 10 people.
- We can accommodate 15 people (this number includes the priest, cantor and server) in the Church and 15 in the Hall (since it has its own entrance/parking lot/bathroom etc.). Two separate preregistrations will be issued for each weekend Liturgy - **one for the Church proper at 12 people and one for 14 people in the Hall (this number includes the usher)**. A second chalice will always be prepared to distribution of Communion upstairs via the minor cleric. **Please note that if you have already pre-registered for any upcoming Liturgy you will be contacted by the office to confirm attendance.**
- Weekday Liturgies and Molebens are cancelled at this time with the exception of Ascension Thursday, May 13th at 9:00am. Parishioners may benefit from the livestreamed services being served at our Cathedral: <https://stjosaphat.ab.ca/>
- In an attempt to allow more people to participate in the Liturgy during these more strict restrictions, **the 6 PM Saturday Vespers will become an evening liturgy**. Please use the appropriate preregistration signups for the Liturgy. **Confessions are cancelled during this time.** Once these restrictions have lifted, we will return to Saturday evening Great Vespers at the same time.
- Those with medical conditions who are unable to wear a mask will be allowed to attend this week but they will need to obtain a medical exemption letter from a health professional if they are planning to attend in the upcoming weeks.

REFLECTION

A New Heart, a New Spirit

PENTECOST SUNDAY AND TRINITY WEEK

Almighty One, renew a cherished and upright Spirit within us, to hold it eternally; the Spirit who is ever united with and ever proceeds from the Father, purging our minds of hateful matter, of burning defilements and uncleanness. (Matins of Pentecost Sunday, troparion of the sixth ode of the katavasias for Pentecost)

On the eve of Pentecost Sunday, we hear this reading from the Old Testament:

Thus says the Lord GoD: "... I will take you from among the nations, gather you out of all countries, and bring you into your own land. Then I will sprinkle clean water on you, and you shall be clean; I will cleanse you from all your filthiness and from all your idols. I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit within you; I will take the heart of stone out of your flesh and give you a heart of flesh. I will put My Spirit within you and cause you to walk in My statutes, and you will keep My judgments and do them. Then you shall dwell in the land that I gave to your fathers; you shall be My people, and I will be your God. I will deliver you from all your uncleanness." (Ezek. 36:22, 24-29)

Through this reading, the themes of water and renewal are again imparted to us, reminding us once more of our renewal in the waters of baptism:

O eternal and unceasing Spring that inexpressibly gushes forth an unending river of goodness, who by Your nature ever pour forth the water of life, water now my thirsty soul, and set me free from the furnace that burns with the flames of the passions. Thus redeem me from the fearful tribulation and dreadful torment of that fire. (Wednesday of Trinity Week, Vespers, third hymn of the aposticha)

Baptism is a rebirth and regeneration. It signifies dying to the world and living to Christ, which means that we live for Him who is not of this world (John 18:36). How unfortunate that so many Christians consider such commitment to be the vocation only of monks and clergy! In baptism, we are given the possibility of outgrowing the "old man" (Adam) and growing into the "new" (Christ):

Master, Lord our God, call Your servant ... to Your holy Illumination and count him/her worthy of the great grace of Your holy Baptism. Put off his/her old self and renew him/her unto eternal life, and fill him/her with the power of Your Holy Spirit for union with Your Christ, that he/she may no longer be a child of the body, but a child of Your kingdom. (Final prayer of the Service for Making a Catechumen)

It is never too late to respond to this sacred calling and to renew our hearts. But let us not make the error of thinking only of "my" baptism, "my" calling, "my" salvation, as though Pentecost spoke to each individual in the Church in isolation. Pentecost is the baptism of the whole Church in the fire of the Holy Spirit and a call to unity in the Spirit of God. This is made clear in the following hymn, which describes Pentecost—when the Apostles preached, and all heard and understood in their own language (Acts 2:1-12)—as a reversal of the curse of Babel, when the nations were divided by a multitude of languages (Gen. 11:1-9):

When the power of the divine Spirit came down, it divinely united in one harmony the voice divided of old of those who had wickedly agreed together, as to believers it gave understanding of knowledge of the Trinity, in which we have been established. (Matins of Pentecost Sunday, troparion of the third ode of the katavasias of Pentecost)

Are we responding as a Church to this gift of unity in the Holy Spirit? How often we prefer division with regard to language and culture over union in the Spirit of Truth! The Holy Spirit is a spirit of unity, and in this unity we find not a flattening of human variety, but harmonious diversity: rich and poor, erudite and simple, young and old, male and female. It is the human and sinful element of the Church that often tries to turn the Church into a gathering of like-minded people with common cultural interests: a church for a particular ethnic group, a church for the young, a church for the old, a church for the super-pious.

The Holy Spirit brings in all sorts and binds them together. It is not we but the Spirit of God who makes the Church the Body of Christ and fills it with truth, wisdom, and holiness:

The Holy Spirit bestows all things: makes prophecies flow, perfects priests, taught the unlettered wisdom, revealed fishermen to be theologians, welds together the whole institution of the Church. O Comforter, of one essence and equal in majesty with the Father and the Son, glory to You. (Small Vespers of Pentecost, third hymn of the stichera)

Whatever faults and errors we make as a church, let us not forget that we are yet the Church of the Holy Spirit, who is holy and divine, without sin or error. He is always with the Church, even when the Church appears to have forgotten itself, just as the disciples did: "You do not know what manner of spirit you are of" (Luke 9:55). But let us not be complacent, for though God is with us, we often refuse to be with Him, and so we must cry out daily for the Holy Spirit to come and dwell in us, to cleanse us, enlighten us, and guide us. For without Him, there can be no true Church, no true Christian, and no true baptism:

O Heavenly King, Comforter, Spirit of Truth, everywhere present and filling all things, Treasury of blessings and Giver of life, come and dwell in us, cleanse us from every stain, and save our souls, O Good One. (Vespers of Pentecost, third hymn of the aposticha). Come to us from on high, O Comforter, as You descended on the Apostles. Thus sanctify us all who proclaim You as true God. (Tuesday of Trinity Week, Matins, third hymn of the Praises for Pentecost)

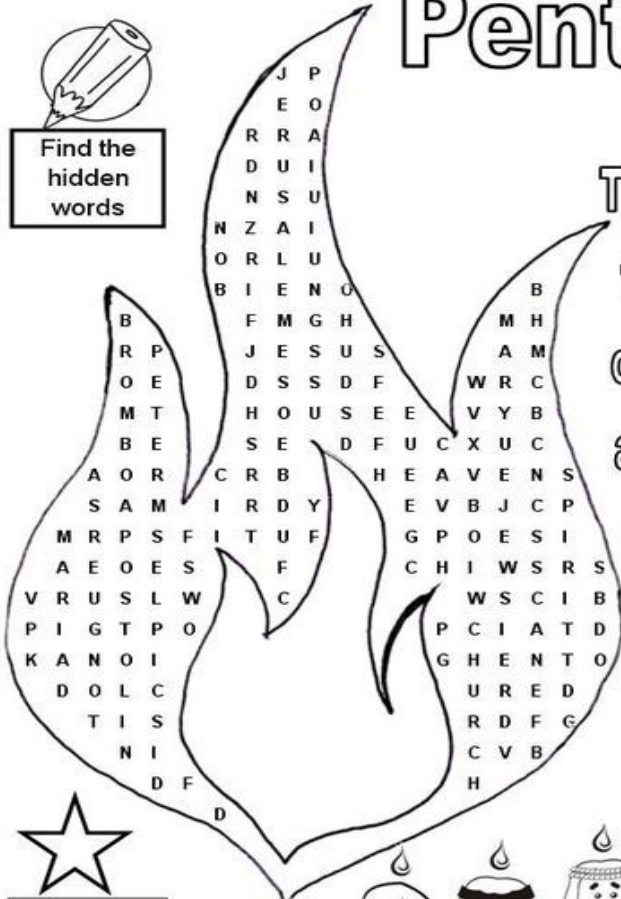
