Gospel

Luke 13:10-17

At that time, Jesus was teaching in one of the synagogues on the Sabbath. And behold, there was a woman who had a spirit of infirmity eighteen years, and was bent over and could in no way raise herself up. But when Jesus saw her, He called her to Him and said to her, "Woman, you are loosed from your infirmity." And He laid His hands on her, and immediately she was made straight, and glorified God.

But the ruler of the synagogue answered with indignation, because Jesus had healed on the

Sabbath; and he said to the crowd, "There are six days on which men ought to work; therefore come and be healed on them, and not on the Sabbath day."

The Lord then answered him and said, "Hypocrite! Does not each one of you on the Sabbath loose his ox or donkey from the stall, and lead *it* away to water it? So ought not this woman, being a daughter of Abraham, whom Satan has bound—think of it—for eighteen years, be loosed from this bond on the Sabbath?" And when He said these things, all His adversaries were put to shame; and all the multitude rejoiced for all the glorious things that were done by Him.

The Church will be limited to 110 people, with overflow seating in the hall (pre-registration/registration are not required). We will keep counts of attendees.



CHRIST THE SOWER

The Christ the Sower mosaic was installed on the north wall of the nave at St. Stephen's in November 2019 and blessed by Father Greg on December 8, 2019. COVID 19 then interfered with the progress needed to complete the work. However, it is now virtually complete with the addition of Candelabra (Sand Stands) and a small plexiglass stand to hold the candles and prayer cards. There is a slot at the top of the small plexiglass stand to accept your kind offering to help cover the cost of the candles.

We encourage you to offer a prayer at the Christ the Sower mosaic, light a candle and place it in either of the Sand Stands. You are welcome to take a prayer card with the photo of the mosaic, an explanation of the parable and a meaningful prayer.


