Luke 14:16-24

The Lord told this parable: "A certain man gave a great supper and invited many, and sent his servant at supper time to say to those who were invited, 'Come, for all things are now ready.' But they all with one *accord* began to make excuses. The first said to him, 'I have bought a piece of ground, and I must go and see it. I ask you to have me excused.' And another said, 'I have bought five yoke of oxen, and I am going to test them. I ask you to have me excused.' Still another said, 'I have

married a wife, and therefore I cannot come.' So that servant came and reported these things to his master. Then the master of the house, being angry, said to his servant, 'Go out quickly into the streets and lanes of the city, and bring in here the poor and the maimed and the lame and the blind.' And the servant said, 'Master, it is done as you commanded, and still there is room.' Then the master said to the servant, 'Go out into the highways and hedges, and compel them to come in, that my house may be filled. 

For the upcoming **Festal Liturgies** we must continue to adhere to the current **Covid restrictions**, with attendance limited to 1/3 fire code capacity in both the church and the hall. This is a total of 102 in the church and 138 in the hall. There will be no pre-registration or proof of vaccination requirement. Seating will be on a first-come-first-serve basis with ushers keeping track of numbers. We strongly encourage you to come early to secure a spot at both Christmas Eve liturgies. As an alternative to those that cannot attend or forego in person attendance on Christmas Eve, please consider joining us at the Christmas Day Liturgy at 10:00am (usually lower in attendance), or online through our live-stream feed. Thank you for your understanding and patience as we work together to Glorify Him in a safe and respectful manner.



Classes are set to begin on Sunday, January 23, 2022. Lessons will take place on Sunday mornings at 9:00 am. There are a total of 10 Lessons ending with First Reconciliation and First Solemn Communion. NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER IN SOLIDARITY WITH INDIGENOUS PEOPLES

The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) each year marks the **National Day of Prayer in Solidarity with Indigenous Peoples** on **December 12**, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas (Roman Catholic liturgical calendar).

In view of this day of prayer, the CCCB issued a Message for the National Day of Prayer in Solidarity with Indigenous Peoples, with the theme We are called to Healing, Forgiveness, Reconciliation.

In addition, <u>educational resources</u> have been prepared to accompany the <u>Advent videos and scripts entitled Indigenous Peoples and the Church Walking Together Toward Healing and</u>

<u>Reconciliation</u>. The resources are based on the theme of the weekly Advent video to encourage further learning and discussion as we prepare for the Indigenous delegation going to Rome, 17-20 December 2021. There are suggestions for individuals and groups, historical content with reflection questions, biographical notes of significant people, and table prayers for the family.
