



Carolyn Muessig did her graduate studies at the University of Toronto, the Pontifical Institute of Mediaeval Studies, and at the Université de Montréal. Since July 2020, she is Chair of Christian Thought in the Department of Classics and Religion, University of Calgary. Previously, she taught in the Department of Religion and Theology, University of Bristol, UK for 25 years where she was Head of Department and served as Director of the University of Bristol's Institute for Research in the Humanities and Arts and also as co-director of the Centre for Medieval Studies. She has written on the history of stigmata, medieval preaching, monasticism, Francis of Assisi, Catherine of Siena, and female educators in the Middle Ages. Carolyn

enjoys public engagement activities that bring together academics, the Church, and wider community.
