






St Stephen's UCWLC Scholarship for \$1000 Guidelines

On the 24th of February, at 5.00 AM the armed forces of the Russian Federation backed by the Republic of Belarus launched an intensive shelling of numerous Ukrainian cities and delivered missile/bomb strikes on the military infrastructure of the Armed Forces of Ukraine. Jesus Prayer 100 Challenge

Will begin on February 28,2021 ending the last day of Lent.



We are excited to announce that Jesus Prayer 100 will start the next stage of the JP 33 prayer challenge pilgrimage. Over the course of the next 40 days, we will commit to practicing the Jesus Prayer 100 times per day, as well read the spiritual classic "The Way of the Pilgrim." There will be short catechetical videos to introduce the various chapters and provide extra challenges throughout the week. Whereas JP 33 can be seen as a wider program to inspire interest in the Jesus Prayer and lay the foundations of a spiritual life, JP 100 is a more focused program requiring a greater commitment.

To participate you must:

- Have completed JP 33.
- Have permission from your Spiritual Director or be in the process of asking for Direction and have the blessing of your pastor (parish priest).
- Parish participation, including participation in liturgy and reception of the sacraments (as one is able) is presumed for this program.
- Although any version of "The Way of the Pilgrim" will work for our discussion, the copy Fr. Mike will use is "The Way of a Pilgrim: The Jesus Prayer Journey—Annotated & Explained" that can be found on Amazon. This version is interspersed with notes and quotes and provides a helpful glossary of terms.
- ZOOM discussion will take place on Thursdays at 6 PM MT or the occasional Friday, depending on Fr. Mike's availability.
