

This he said, not that he cared for the poor, but because he was a thief, and had the money box; and he used to take what was put in it.

> The next day a great multitude that had come to the feast, when they heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem, took branches of palm trees and went out to meet Him, and cried out:

"Hosanna!

'Blessed is He who comes in the name of the LORD!' The King of Israel!"

Then Jesus, when He had found a young donkey, sat on it; as it is written:

"Fear not, daughter of Zion; Behold, your King is coming, Sitting on a donkey's colt."

His disciples did not understand these things at first; but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things were written about Him and that they had done these things to Him.

Therefore the people, who were with Him when He called Lazarus out of his tomb and raised him from the dead, bore witness. For this reason the people also met Him, because they heard that He had done this sign.



Ask Fr. Mike:

Should I go to a Spiritual, New Age or Pranic Healer?

You should NOT go to a Spiritual, Pranic, or New Age Healer.

There are three major problems with personal spiritual healers. The first is that the cosmology (what we believe about creation, the nature of good and evil etc.) these healers hold are incompatible with Christian belief and faith. Christian belief about good and evil, creation out of nothing and the true nature of illness has been received through the Church- it is simply contradictory to hold Christian beliefs and New Age beliefs simultaneously.

The second problem is that true power to heal is essentially God's power, and not something we can "control." This view of controlling God is what the Church refers to as *magic* or *sorcery* and is a sin against the First Commandment to love God:

All practices of *magic* or *sorcery*, by which one attempts to tame occult powers, so as to place them at one's service and have a supernatural power over others—even if this were for the sake of restoring their health—are gravely contrary to the virtue of religion. These practices are even more to be condemned when accompanied by the intention of harming someone, or when they have recourse to the intervention of demons. Wearing charms is also reprehensible. *Spiritism* often implies divination or magical practices; the Church for her part warns the faithful against it. Recourse to so-called traditional cures does not justify either the invocation of evil powers or the exploitation of another's credulity.

Some spiritual healers claim to "tap into Holy Spirit" in order to provide spiritual healing. This is the language of magic explained above. The Holy Spirit is personal, *HE* is a Person, not an ambivalent power that can be used by us (even for good things). We are *His* servants, not the other way around.

Spiritual healing of any kind is the result of a relationship with the Holy Trinity. This relationship is nurtured and strengthened in the context of the Holy Church, established by Christ Himself and sustained by the Holy Spirit. For this reason, spiritual healing always happens under the purview and guidance of the priesthood and the pastorship of a particular parish. The Holy Mysteries (Sacraments) of healing in the Church are Confession and the Sacrament of the Sick. House blessings are also opportunities for spiritual healing. Another wonderful opportunity for spiritual healing is our Anointing Service on Holy Wednesday, April 5th at 7 PM.

Our own Catechism, Christ our Pascha put it beautifully:

Human ailments, suffering, and death are consequences of the Fall. Christ came to conquer sin, the cause of all our woes. Only Christ, as the God-man, has the power to free us from sin. He accomplishes this by means of forgiveness: "Friend, your sins are forgiven you" (*Lk*

5:20). Quite often, a physical cure or healing—as a result of forgiveness— becomes the visible sign of a spiritual change (in Greek, *metanoia*) within a person: "Stand up and take up your bed and go home" (*Lk* 5:24). Christ heals us by forgiving our sins and restoring our physical health. Healing is only possible when faith—one's openness to God—is present: "Do you believe that I am able to do this?" (*Mt* 9:28). Faith opens a person to receive God's gift, whereas unbelief becomes an obstacle to the reception of this gift: "And [Jesus] did not do many deeds of power

[in Nazareth], because of their unbelief " (Mt 13:58).

Thirdly, spiritual healing cannot be bought or sold. Simon the Magician in Acts 8:20, after witnessing the Apostles' healing tried to buy the Holy Spirit so that he could sell healing to others. The attempt to buy or sell spiritual things is now referred to by his name:

Simony is defined as the buying or selling of spiritual things. ⁵³ To Simon the magician, who wanted to buy the spiritual power he saw at work in the apostles, St. Peter responded: "Your silver perish with you, because you thought you could obtain God's gift with money!" ⁵⁴ Peter thus held to the words of Jesus: "You received without pay, give without pay." ⁵⁵ It is impossible to appropriate to oneself spiritual goods and behave toward them as their owner or master, for they have their source in God. One can receive them only from him, without payment. (1578)

A wonderful prayer that helps to heal us and restores our whole soul and body to Christ is the **Jesus Prayer**. I invite you to participate in our **Jesus Prayer 33 challenges** to learn more about this incredible prayer and how it relates to true spiritual healing as attested to by the saints who have prayed this prayer for well over a millennium.

As always, I invite you to come and chat with me if you need any more guidance in this matter or other matters of faith and morals.

Glory be to Jesus Christ, the True Physician of our souls and bodies!
