Margaret Chisholm Resettlement Centre (MCRC) A temporary accommodation facility that can accommodate up to 60 Government Assisted Refugees (GAR's) at a time.

Refugee Child Enhanced Integration Project Developed to specifically support refugee children and youth in the school system upon their arrival in Calgary.

Refugee Claimants Transitioning into the Community (RCTC) Our program staff assist refugee claimants during their claim process and provide support when addressing any issues which may arise.

Resettlement Assistance Program (RAP) This program assists newly arrived Government Assisted Refugees with the resettlement process.

Sponsorship of Refugees Program As a Sponsorship Agreement Holder (SAH), CCIS assists with the private sponsorship of refugees.
